CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, Douglas J. Webb, Permittee has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a drilled well, pump, motor and distribution system for commercial purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: NE 1/4 SW 1/4 of Section 8, T.20N., R.19E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the SW corner of said Section 8, bears S. 48° 31' 55" W., a distance of 3309.60 feet situated in Washoe County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Post-office address Reno, Nevada
Amount of appropriation 0.1 c.f.s., but not to exceed 2.74 million gallons annually
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
Date of priority of appropriation August 29, 1978

Description of works of diversion, manner and place of use:
Water is produced from a 6 inch casing, 285 foot deep well, thence conveyed through a distribution system to serve a 25 unit trailer park, within portions of the SW 1/4 NE 1/4, SE 1/4 NW 1/4, NE 1/4 SW 1/4 and NW 1/4 SE 1/4, all in Section 8, T.20N., R.19E., M.D.B.&M.

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

The total combined duty of water under this certificate and Permits 35823 and 35824 shall not exceed 2.74 million gallons per annum.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
