CERTIFICATE OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER

WHEREAS, J. R. Caldwell, Agent has presented to the State Engineer of the State of Nevada Proof of Application of Water to Beneficial Use, from an underground source through a drilled well, pump and distribution system for irrigation and domestic purposes. The point of diversion of water from the source is as follows: SW 1/4 NE 1/4 Section 25, T.35N., R.37E., M.D.B.&M., or at a point from which the N 1/4 corner of said Section 25 bears N. 12° 10' W., a distance of 1510 feet situated in Humboldt County, State of Nevada.

Now KNOW YE, That the State Engineer, under the provisions of NRS 533.425, has determined the date, source, purpose, amount of appropriation, and the place where such water is appurtenant, as follows:

Post-office address. Winnemucca, Nevada
Amount of appropriation. 0.2 c.f.s., but not to exceed 40.0 acre feet per annum
Period of use, from January 1st to December 31st of each year
\* Date of priority of appropriation. March 19, 1962

Description of land to which the water is appurtenant:
6.40 acres in the NW 1/4 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 25, T.35N., R.37E., M.D.B.&M.
3.60 acres in the SW 1/4 SW 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 25, T.35N., R.37E., M.D.B.&M.
10.00 acres total

This certificate is issued subject to the terms of the permit.

\*This certificate changes the point of diversion and place of use of a portion of Permit 29222, Certificate No. 8708 which goes back through Permits 28262, 25795, 22839 and 20374, hence the date of priority of this certificate remains the same as Permit 20374.

The right to water hereby determined is limited to the amount which can be beneficially used, not to exceed the amount above specified, and the use is restricted to the place and for the purpose as set forth herein.
