



Presented herewith is the Preliminary Order of Determination defining the rights in and to the waters of Jersey Hot Springs, Butcher Canyon, Jersey Canyon (a.k.a. Old Town Canyon), Cedar Canyon and Home Station Wash and their tributaries, and springs located within the Jersey Valley Hydrographic Basin (No. 132), Pershing and Lander Counties, Nevada. This Preliminary Order is prepared under the provisions of Chapter 533 of the Nevada Revised Statutes.

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I. GENERAL

On July 9, 2010, the State Engineer issued a Notice of Order Initiating Proceedings to Determine Water Rights in *In the Matter of the Determination of the Relative Rights in and to All Waters of Jersey Hot Springs, a Surface Source, all the Water of Butcher Canyon, Jersey Canyon (a.k.a. Old Town Canyon), Cedar Canyon and Home Station Wash and their Tributaries, and Springs Located Within the Jersey Valley Hydrographic Basin (No. 132), Pershing and Lander Counties, Nevada.* The Order initiated proceedings to adjudicate prestatutory vested rights to waters in the described area, according to Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) § 533.090 through 533.320, inclusive.

A copy of the Notice of Order Initiating Proceedings to Determine Water Rights was served by certified mail July 14, 2010, pursuant to NRS § 533.095 to persons identified as owning land within the subject area that could be potential claimants. The Notice was published pursuant to NRS § 533.095(3) on July 15, 22, 29, and August 5, 2010, in the Lovelock Review-Miner located in Lovelock, Nevada, and on July 21, 28, August 4 and August 11, 2010, in the Battle Mountain Bugle, located in Battle Mountain, Nevada. Both are newspapers of general circulation within the boundary of the subject adjudication area.

On August 25, 2010, the State Engineer issued the Notice of Order for Taking Proofs to Determine Water Rights, pursuant to NRS § 533.110. This Notice set forth the requirement that all those making claims to the waters of Jersey Hot Springs, Butcher Canyon, Jersey Canyon (a.k.a. Old Town Canyon), Cedar Canyon and Home Station Wash and their tributaries and springs located within the Jersey Valley Hydrographic Basin (No. 132) were required to make proof of their claims between September 30, 2010, and December 31, 2010. A copy of the Notice of Order for Taking Proofs to Determine Water Rights was served by certified mail August 30, 2010, to persons identified as owning land within the subject area that could be potential claimants. The Notice was published on September 2, 9, 16, and 23, 2010, in the Lovelock Review-Miner located in Lovelock, Nevada, and on September 1, 8, 15, and 22, 2010, in the Battle Mountain Bugle, located in Battle Mountain, Nevada.

A request for extension of the period of time for filing proofs was submitted on behalf of claimant Joe Saval Co., LLC on December 15, 2010. The State Engineer granted this request pursuant to NRS § 533.125(1), extending the period for filing proofs to January 31, 2011.

Field investigations of the Proofs of Appropriation (claims) were conducted by staff of the Office of the Staff Engineer on several dates between 2009 and 2013 for claims in Jersey Valley and at the range front. The field investigators' observations and measurements were reduced to reports of field investigation and are on file in the Office of the State Engineer.

Pursuant to NRS § 533.140, the State Engineer affixed his signature to the Abstract of Claims on March 28, 2014 and hereby issues this Preliminary Order of Determination.




Figure 1: ADJUDICATION VICINITY MAP

II. WATER SOURCES AND FLOWS

The sources of water that are the subject of this adjudication include the waters of Butcher Canyon, Jersey Canyon (a.k.a. Old Town Canyon), Cedar Canyon, Home Station Wash, the six springs that make up the Jersey Hot Spring Complex located roughly one-mile west of the range-bounding fault, and various spring sources along the western slope of the Fish Creek Mountains and northern extent of the Augusta Mountains. (Figure 1). The area is located within portions of T.25N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M., T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M., T.26N., R.41E., M.D.B.&M., T.27N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M., and T.27N., R.41E., M.D.B.&M., all within Pershing and Lander Counties, Nevada.

The Fish Creek range is dominated by Miocene tuffaceous sedimentary rocks, underlain by older tertiary and pre-tertiary volcanic rocks. The crest of the range is near 8,000 feet and the Jersey Valley floor is approximately 4,000 feet in elevation. Springs are widely distributed in the adjudication area. Streams within the adjudication area generally flow in a westerly direction into Jersey Valley. Typical of Nevada's mountain streams, runoff peaks in the spring and then recedes during the summer months until there is minimal or zero flow. Total annual discharge is heavily dependent on winter snowfall and varies from year to year.

The Jersey Hot Spring Complex (Springs A-F) is located on the pediment surface roughly one-mile west of the range bounding fault near Butcher and Jersey Canyons. The alignment of the springs suggests that they lie along a projection of the mountain front fault.¹ The largest of the springs is commonly called Jersey Hot Spring, and is also referred to as Spring "F" in this proceeding. Flow measurements of springs and streams recorded during field investigations by staff of the Office of the State Engineer are shown in Table 1.

III. DETERMINATION OF RIGHTS TO THE USE OF WATER

Claims to prestatutory vested water rights on sources of water subject to this adjudication are established by filing a proof of appropriation in the Office of the State Engineer and submitting evidence to support the claimed date of priority, manner of use, place of use and the amount of water actually diverted and applied to beneficial use. Submitted evidence is reviewed in conjunction with other records available to determine the limit and extent of vested water rights claimed in this proceeding.

The reasoning used to determine duty and priority for the use of water for irrigation and stock watering is described in this section. The limit and extent of water rights issued for all manners of use is limited to the quantity of water reasonably necessary for such use. The period of use for all manners of use is January 1st to December 31st unless otherwise specified.

A. Irrigation

Priority dates for irrigation are established in this adjudication as the year in which a water source was initially applied at its current place of use, as documented by claimants. An earlier priority date may be determined in accordance with the doctrine of "relation back" if the work of constructing facilities to divert and use water at the place of use was pursued with reasonable diligence. If the doctrine of "relation back" applies, the priority date for an irrigation water right would be established as the year in which steps were first taken to obtain that right.

Duty for irrigation purposes in this adjudication is 4.0 acre-feet per acre. This duty is based on the amount of water required to be diverted from the source to grow a full season of well-watered alfalfa. Sources of water that are commingled for irrigation at the same place of use have a total combined duty of 4.0 acre-feet per acre.

The State Engineer recognizes that delivery of this duty is limited by water availability at the source, and in many years water at the source is not sufficient to meet crop water demands.

B. Stock Watering

Priority dates for stock watering are established in this adjudication as the year in which the water source was initially used for stock watering, as documented by claimants. Chain of title from the initial usage to the current owner is required to show proof of a vested water right.

Claims filed for stock watering refer to differing numbers and type of livestock from their earliest date of beneficial use to the present. The State Engineer recognizes that the number and type of livestock that utilize water from a source varies depending on available feed in different parts of the range at different times of year, and on management practices on the public lands. In this proceeding, stock-water duty is

quantified based on the cumulative number and type of livestock currently using these water sources. Duty is not a measure of water actually available on a perennial basis.

IV. BASIS OF CLAIMS

A. Irrigation Uses

All vested claims of water rights for irrigation in this adjudication are for the Home Station Ranch, using commingled waters of Home Station Wash, Cedar Canyon, Jersey Hot Springs and Butcher Canyon. Home Station Ranch is located at the mouth of Home Station Wash and Cedar Canyon from which waters are detained and used for irrigation. Waters of Butcher Canyon flow overland toward Jersey Hot Springs, and a pipeline conveys water from Jersey Hot Springs to Home Station Ranch a distance of approximately three miles. Current owners and claimants, Mike and Barbara Stremmer, provided detailed documentation of the early use of water for irrigation to support their claims.

Jersey Hot Springs was initially used for irrigation at a different location than Home Station Ranch. This occurred at least as early as 1878 when James Watt filed a statement with Lander County establishing the "Watt Irrigation Milling and Mining Ditch and Flume" later referred to as the "Watt Irrigation Ditch" from which he raised a crop. The ditch extended 42 chains (0.53 miles) southwesterly from the Hot Springs. This property was later claimed by E.E. Starrett, who sold it to W.T. Jenkins in 1886 described as the Hot Springs Ranch. In 1898, the property was part of a possessory claim filed by W.T.'s wife Edith Jenkins, who later conveyed all her holdings to the W.T. Jenkins Company after W.T.'s death in 1899.

Home Station Ranch was occupied at least by 1899, when Jacob Abel recorded "Possessory claim and improvements situated at the mouth of Home Station canyon about 3 miles south of the old town of Jersey."² Earlier reference was made to the use of waters of Home Station Wash for irrigation in the 1886 deed transfer from E.E. Starrett to W.T. Jenkins, but there is no documentation of the extent to which this right was put to beneficial use. Nor is there documentation that W.T. Jenkins, Edith Jenkins or the W.T. Jenkins Company conveyed this right to anyone else.

It is not clear exactly when the three-mile pipeline from Jersey Hot Springs or from Watt's Irrigation Ditch to Home Station Ranch was initially constructed, or when irrigation at the Hot Springs Ranch ceased. The W.T. Jenkins Company purchased Home Station Ranch from John Abel, May L. Abel, and Jake E. Abel on April 3, 1905, but there is no mention of using Jersey Hot Springs for irrigation at the Home Station Ranch. In the deed transfer, the site is documented as "20 acres of land at the junction of Willow Creek and Home Station Creek, known as the Home Station Ranch. Also, the water rights to Willow Creek and Home Station Creek."^{3,4} One year after the W.T. Jenkins

Company purchased the ranch, they recorded 160 acres as "Possessory claim and improvements situated at the mouth of Home Station Canyon about 3 miles south of the old town of Jersey formerly owned by J.W. and Jacob E. Abel."⁵ The expansion of Home Station Ranch from 20 acres in 1905, to 160 acres in 1906, was likely accompanied by improved storage capacity and conveyance efficiency from sources of water controlled by the W.T. Jenkins Company, including Home Station Wash, Cedar Canyon, Jersey Hot Springs, and Butcher Canyon.

Claimants for irrigation at Home Station Ranch cite the General Land Office (GLO) map as early documentation of the pipeline from Jersey Hot Springs to Home Station Ranch. The GLO map was surveyed between 1915 and 1929 and published in 1930. The map shows a pipeline from Jersey Hot Springs to Home Station Ranch, and it also shows the "Old Pipe Line" which conveys water to Home Station Ranch from the vicinity of the former Watts Irrigation Ditch and Hot Springs Ranch. No dates are given for use or abandonment of the Old Pipe Line, and therefore this GLO map does not support the claim of prestatutory use of Jersey Hot Springs waters at Home Station Ranch.

B. Stock Watering Uses

Documentation to support proof of the continuous use of surface water for stock watering prior to March 1, 1905, was filed by three claimants. The basis of claims for each of the three parties is discussed in this section. Claimants in this proceeding are successors to past ranch operators with a long history of sharing range and water resources, and they are also successors to a range line agreement that divided livestock access to range and water resources beginning in 1971. (Appendix A).

1. Claimant Stremler

Mike and Barbara Stremler claim a stock-water right with a priority date of 1872, when C.A. Kyle recorded improvements at ranches in Pleasant Valley and Buena Vista Valley. In 1874, C. A. Kyle recorded "Improvements on ranch 10 miles south of Jersey District"⁶ which was later described as Kyle's Horse Ranch. Testimony from the 1881 district court case *Kyle v. Kyle*⁷ describes grazing use in the area encompassed by this adjudication. C.T. Kyle sold the Kyle Horse Ranch, along with the Cleveland Corral located four miles southwest of Jersey Mining Camp, to Frank Martin in 1887. Frank Martin sold these holdings to the W.T. Jenkins Company in 1902, to which claimant Stremler is a successor in interest.

2. Claimant Saval

The Joe Saval Company, LLC claims a stock-water right with a priority date of 1875, acquired through conveyances of Jersey Ranch, Buffalo Ranch, and the Clark Ranches and their appurtenant range and water rights.

The Jersey Ranch was acquired by the Saval Estate from Marius Allard in 1951. Allard was in possession of the property with his partner Joseph Hermelin, who had settled the property "in the month of April, 1917, when the lands were unsurveyed and unreserved."⁸ The Jersey Ranch had been occupied previous to Hermelin's acquisition, but there was no conveyance of ranching interests at the Jersey Ranch from previous occupants to Allard and/or Hermelin.

Title to the Buffalo Ranch was acquired by Joe Saval in 1917 from Moses and Clara Gilbert, who acquired it from Lena Leick in 1915. Leick acquired title in 1914 from partners Marius Allard and Rudolf Hofman. Leick, Allard and Hofman had purchased the ranch in 1906 from Jacob and Mary Hofman. Jacob Hofman first registered a cattle and horse brand with Humboldt County in 1890.

The Joe Saval Company, LLC is also successor to the Clark Ranches. Although Wm. Clark recorded a brand with Humboldt County in 1873, firm documentation of a Clark in the area subject to this adjudication was an application to appropriate spring water in the Fish Creek Mountains in 1919 by Samuel R. Clark, Harry L. Clark, and Prudencio Mendive. The application was protested by Hermelin, but approved by State Engineer George Malone in 1922. Appropriators named on the 1929 certificate of appropriation are Samuel R. Clark, Harry L. Clark, and Joe Saval. Joe Saval later acquired the Clark properties through bank holdings in the 1930's.

The Joe Saval Estate acquired a parcel of land in the vicinity of Cottonwood Pass and the headwaters of Fish Creek that was previously held by the W.T. Jenkins Company prior to 1964, at a time when the W.T. Jenkins Company also owned and operated out of Jersey Valley and Dixie Valley properties, including Home Station Ranch and the ranch formerly known as Kyle's Horse Ranch. In the sale from the W.T. Jenkins Company to Ormachea in 1964, the deed refers to this area as the Belzarena Lands. The Joe Saval Estate acquired the property in 1976.

3. Claimant Paris

Bert Paris claims a stock-water right with a priority date of 1886, when W.T. Jenkins acquired rights to land and water resources in Jersey Valley from E.E. Starrett. Bert Paris claims a vested water right to Wildcat Gap Spring (a.k.a. Moses Spring #3). This spring lies within the United States Bureau of Land Management Cottonwood grazing allotment, on which Paris is a currently licensed operator. Documentation showing chain of title from W.T. Jenkins to Bert Paris was not submitted with the proof filed in the Office of the State Engineer.

4. 1971 Range Line Agreement

In 1971, a range line agreement signed by the Joe Saval Estate, DeMar and Joe Dahl, M.L. Investment Co., Manuel Chalagas, and Paul L. Engel, was approved by the BLM District Manager. The range line agreement proposed to divide the South Buffalo Valley Unit into two allotments. All the signatories were actively grazing this range. (Appendix A). The boundary was fenced in the 1970's.

Claimant Stremler is actively grazing the land south of the 1971 allotment boundary, referred to as the Home Station Allotment and Jersey Valley Allotment. The Stremlers are successors in interest to DeMar and Joe Dahl, a signatory to the 1971 range line agreement. Claimant Joe Saval Company, LLC or its lessees has continuously grazed the land on the north side of the grazing allotment boundary and within the area encompassed by this adjudication since the boundary was agreed to in 1971, referred to as the South Buffalo Allotment and the Buffalo Valley Allotment. The Joe Saval Company, LLC is the successor of the Joe Saval Estate, a signatory to the 1971 agreement.

The 1971 range line agreement included a special condition for the waters of Cedar Canyon to be piped across the allotment boundary to provide stock-water on both sides of the boundary line. Springs in the headwaters of Cedar Canyon are within the Buffalo Valley Allotment and have been in continuous use by the Joe Saval Company or its lessee. Waters at the mouth of Cedar Canyon are in the Jersey Valley Allotment and have been in continuous use for stock-water by the Stremlers and their predecessors. The pipeline described in the 1971 range line agreement was not built, and no diligence was shown to enact this special condition.

V. FINDINGS OF THE STATE ENGINEER UPON REVIEW OF CLAIMS

A. Irrigation Uses

The evidence filed with claims in this adjudication support prestatutory vested water rights for irrigation of 20 acres at Home Station Ranch using the waters of Home Station Wash and Cedar Canyon with a priority date of 1899. Cedar Canyon is not described in the evidence submitted, but runoff from Cedar Canyon flows directly onto the land irrigated at Home Station Ranch. The evidence provided indicates that Jersey Hot Springs water was first used for irrigation at Home Station Ranch after March 1, 1905, and does not support a claim of a prestatutory vested water right.

B. Stock Watering Uses

The evidence provided with claims in this adjudication support prestatutory vested water rights to stock-water held by the Joe Saval Company, LLC and Mike and Barbara Stremler with a priority date of 1872. Both claimants are successors in part to the W.T. Jenkins Company, who was a successor to the Kyle Ranch operators who raised livestock in the area subject to this adjudication beginning in 1872. The Stremlers, d.b.a. Jersey Valley Cattle Company, currently run 300 head of cattle and the Saval lessee

currently runs 1,044 head of cattle within range areas determined in the 1971 range line agreement and within the area subject to this adjudication.

VI. PROOFS DETERMINED TO BE VALID

The field investigations conducted by personnel of the Office of the State Engineer determined that the waters of Butcher Canyon, Jersey Canyon, Cedar Canyon, and Home Station Wash watersheds and the Jersey Hot Springs complex (six springs) and various spring sources located within the boundaries of the adjudication area are being placed to beneficial use for irrigation, stock watering, and domestic purposes.

The proofs of appropriation summarized below are determined to be valid or partially valid vested water rights established prior to March 1, 1905. The limit and extent of each proof and existing permitted water rights and certificated water rights perfected under the applicable statutes are described in detail in Appendix A.

For a complete listing of all of the claims of vested rights submitted in response to this proceeding, or any permits and certificates filed in the Office of the State Engineer, refer to the Abstract of Claims.

Proof of Appropriation V-01934 was filed on August 1, 1925, by W. T. Jenkins Company, Inc., claiming a vested right from Home Station Creek⁹ with a priority date "Prior to 1905" for irrigation of 102.88 acres of land within Section 7 of T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M., and for domestic and stock watering purposes. A supporting cultural map was filed August 1, 1925, identifying specific areas supporting alfalfa, grain, meadow and vegetables. The proof was amended multiple times by current owners Mike and Barbara Stremler, with the final amendment filed December 16, 2013, for irrigation of 127.55 acres of alfalfa within Section 7 of T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M., with a priority date of 1872. A supporting map to the amended proof was filed on January 27, 2011, and an amended map was filed August 2, 2012, identifying 127.55 acres of alfalfa.

In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for irrigation of 20 acres from the above-named source with a priority date of 1899 is determined to be valid. Waters of Home Station Wash are commingled with waters identified under Proof V-10019 from Cedar Canyon to irrigate the same 20 acres. The place of use is located within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ and the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$, of Section 7, T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of irrigation.

In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right to waters of Home Station Wash for stock watering of 300 head of cattle and for domestic uses with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid under Proof of Appropriation V-01934. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09793 was filed on April 6, 2009, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Butcher Canyon Spring for stock watering. The

claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. This Proof supercedes the water right under Permit 77710. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09794 was filed on April 6, 2009, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Un-named Spring [B] for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. Proof of Appropriation V-09795 was filed on April 6, 2009, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Unnamed Spring [C] for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09796 was filed on April 6, 2009, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Unnamed Spring [D] for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. This Proof supercedes the water right under Permit 77475. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09797 was filed on April 6, 2009, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Unnamed Spring [E] for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. This Proof supercedes the water right under Permit 77474. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09798 was filed on April 6, 2009, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Jersey Hot Spring [F] for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-

named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09799 was filed on April 6, 2009, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Unnamed Spring [A] for stock watering. Proof of Appropriation V-09889 was filed on January 29, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremler claiming a vested right from Edith Spring for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 7,000 head of cattle and 33,000 sheep in the first year and 300 head of cattle in subsequent years. An amended proof was filed December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 300 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09967 was filed on August 9, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremler claiming a vested right from Cedar Spring for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 7,000 head of cattle and 33,000 sheep in the first year and 300 head of cattle in subsequent years. An amended proof was filed December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 300 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09970 was filed on August 9, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremler claiming a vested right from Lower Cedar Spring for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 7,000 head of cattle and 33,000 sheep in the first year and 300 head of cattle in subsequent years. An amended proof was filed December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 300 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09972 was filed on August 9, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremler claiming a vested right from Stage Stop Spring for stock watering. Proof of Appropriation V-09996 was filed on October 6, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremmer claiming a vested right from Moses Spring #2 for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 7,000 head of cattle and 33,000 sheep in the first year and 300 head of cattle in subsequent years. An amended proof was filed December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 300 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-09998 was filed on October 6, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremmer claiming a vested right from Moses Spring #4 for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 7,000 head of cattle and 33,000 sheep in the first year and 300 head of cattle in subsequent years. An amended proof was filed December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 300 head of cattle from the above-named source with

a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10013 was filed on October 6, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremmer claiming a vested right from Tamarisk Spring for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 7,000 head of cattle and 33,000 sheep in the first year and 300 head of cattle in subsequent years. An amended proof was filed December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 300 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10019 was filed on January 27, 2011, by Mike and Barbara Stremmer claiming a vested right from Cedar Canyon for irrigation of 127.55 acres of alfalfa within Section 7 of T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M., and for stock watering and domestic uses. An amended proof was filed December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. A supporting map was filed on January 27, 2011, and an amended map was filed August 2, 2012.

In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for irrigation of 20 acres from the above-named source is established under this proof with a priority date of 1899. Waters of Cedar Canyon are commingled with waters identified under Proof V-01934 from Home Station Wash to irrigate the same 20 acres. The place of use is located within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ and the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$, of Section 7, T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of irrigation.

In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right to waters of Home Station Wash for stock watering of 300 head of cattle and for domestic uses with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid under Proof V-10019. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10027 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Jersey Spring #1 for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10028 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Jersey Spring #2 for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10029 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Jersey Spring # 3 for stock watering. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10030 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Jersey Spring #4 for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. Proof of Appropriation V-10036 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Cedar Spring #2 for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10037 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Cedar Spring #3 for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10038 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Cedar Spring #4 for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10039 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Cedar Spring #5 for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10042 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Jersey Canyon Spring for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first

year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. This Proof supercedes the water right under Permit 77711. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10043 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Jersey Canyon Wash [a.k.a. Old Town Canyon] seasonal flow for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. This Proof supercedes the water right under Permit 80759. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10044 was filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Butcher Canyon Wash seasonal flow for stock watering. The claimed number of animals watered was 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep in the first year and 1,044 to 2,000 head of cattle in subsequent years. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for stock watering of 1,044 head of cattle from the above-named source with a priority date of 1872 is determined to be valid. *See*, Sections III and V for discussion of stock watering.

VII. PERMITTED AND CERTIFICATED WATER RIGHTS

The following list of permitted and certificated water rights is for surface water and groundwater sources within the area encompassed by this adjudication proceeding. These appropriations were acquired pursuant to Chapter 533 and 534 of the Nevada Revised Statutes. The limit and extent of existing permitted and certificated water rights are described in detail in Appendix A.

Permit 5778, Certificate 1533 is for stock-water from an unnamed spring to water 2,500 sheep with a priority date of September 29, 1919. The current owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. The duty for this permit is supplemental to the duty for proofs determined to be valid in this proceeding for stock-water held by the Joe Saval Company, LLC.

Permit 5779, Certificate 1534 is for stock-water from an unnamed spring to water 2,500 sheep with a priority date of September 29, 1919. The current owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. The duty for this permit is supplemental to the duty for proofs determined to be valid in this proceeding for stock-water held by the Joe Saval Company, LLC.

Permit 5780, Certificate 1535 is for stock-water from an unnamed spring to water 2,500 sheep with a priority date of September 29, 1919. The current owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. The duty for this permit is supplemental to the duty

for proofs determined to be valid in this proceeding for stock-water held by the Joe Saval Company, LLC.

Permit 77472, Certificate 19270 is for stock-water from Jersey Spring "A" to water 1,044 head of cattle with a priority date of October 13, 2008, and a period of use from March 1 to September 14. The current owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. This permit was top-filed by Proof of Appropriation V-09799. The State Engineer determines that Proof V-09799 accurately depicts the spring source, and that the water right under Permit 77472, Certificate 19270 is superceded by Proof of Appropriation V-09799 in this proceeding.

Permit 77474 is for stock-water from Jersey Spring "E" to water 1,044 head of cattle with a priority date of October 13, 2008, and a period of use from March 1 to September 14. The current owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. This permit was top-filed by Proof of Appropriation V-09797. The State Engineer determines that Proof V-09797 accurately depicts the spring source, and that the water right under Permit 77474 is superceded by Proof of Appropriation V-09797.

Permit 77475, Certificate 19272 is for stock-water from Jersey Spring "D" to water 1,044 head of cattle with a priority date of October 13, 2008, and a period of use from March 1 to September 14. The current owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. This permit was top-filed by Proof of Appropriation V-09796. The State Engineer determines that Proof of Appropriation V-09796 accurately depicts the spring source, and that the water right under Permit 77475, Certificate 19272 is superceded by Proof of Appropriation V-09796.

Permit 77477, Certificate 19275 is for stock-water from Jersey Spring "B" to water 1,044 head of cattle with a priority date of October 13, 2008, and a period of use from March 1 to September 14. The current owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. This permit was top-filed by Proof of Appropriation V-09794. The State Engineer determines that Proof of Appropriation V-09794 accurately depicts the spring source, and that the water right under Permit 77477, Certificate 19275 is superceded by Proof of Appropriation V-09794.

Permit 77710 is for stock-water from Butcher Canyon Spring to water 1,044 head of cattle with a priority date of December 22, 2008, and a period of use from March 1 to September 14. The owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. This permit was top-filed by Proof of Appropriation V-09793. The State Engineer determines that Proof of Appropriation V-09793 accurately depicts the spring source, and that the water right under Permit 77710 is superceded by Proof of Appropriation V-09793.

Permit 77711, Certificate 18905 is for stock-water from Jersey Canyon Spring to water 1,044 head of cattle with a priority date of December 22, 2008, and a period of use from March 1 to September 14. The owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. This permit was top-filed by Proof of Appropriation V-10042. The State Engineer determines that Proof of Appropriation V-10042 accurately depicts the spring source, and that the

water right under Permit 77711, Certificate 18905 is superceded by Proof of Appropriation V-10042.

Permit 77712 is for irrigation from an underground source with a duty of 240.0 acre-feet annually and a diversion rate of 1.0 cfs and a priority date of December 22, 2008. The owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. The total combined duty for Permits 77712, 80760, and 81541 is not to exceed 240 acre-feet annually.

Permit 77713 is for stock-water from an underground source to water 1,044 head of cattle, with a priority date of December 22, 2008. The current owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC.

Permit 80759 is for stock-water from Jersey Canyon Creek to water 1,044 head of cattle with a priority date of April 6, 2011. The owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. This permit was top-filed by Proof of Appropriation V-10043. The State Engineer determines that Proof of Appropriation V-10043 accurately depicts the spring source, and that the water right under Permit 80759 is superceded by Proof of Appropriation V-10043.

Permit 80760 is for irrigation from Jersey Canyon Creek with a duty of 195.84 acre-feet annually and a diversion rate of 4.0 cfs with a priority date of April 6, 2011. The owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. The total combined duty for Permits 77712, 80760, and 81541 is not to exceed 240 acre-feet annually.

Permit 81541 is for irrigation from Old Town Canyon Creek (Jersey Canyon) with a duty of 44.16 acre-feet seasonally and a diversion rate of 0.1472 cfs with priority date August 27, 1918. The period of use is April 1st through September 1st. The owner of record is Joe Saval Company, LLC. The total combined duty for Permits 77712, 80760, and 81541 is not to exceed 240 acre-feet annually.

VIII. REJECTED PROOFS

Proof of Appropriation V-01933 was filed on August 1, 1925, by W. T. Jenkins Company, Inc. claiming a vested right from Hot Springs with a priority date "Prior to 1905" for irrigation of 59.28 acres of land within Section 7 of T.26N., R40E., M.D.B.&M., and for domestic and stock watering uses. A supporting map was filed August 1, 1925, identifying specific areas supporting alfalfa, grain, meadow and vegetables. This proof was amended on November 29, 2010, by current owners Mike and Barbara Stremler claiming a vested right from Jersey Hot Spring(s) with a priority date of 1878 for irrigation of 240 acres within Section 7 of T.26N., R40E., M.D.B.&M. and 40 acres within Section 12 of T.26N., R.39E., M.D.B.&M. This claim was amended a second time on December 16, 2013, by Mike and Barbara Stremler claiming a vested right from Jersey Hot Spring "F" with a priority date of 1872 for irrigation of 127.55 acres of alfalfa within Section 7 of T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M. A supporting map to the amended proof was filed on January 27, 2011, and an amended map was filed August 2, 2012, identifying 127.55 acres of alfalfa. This proof is denied for lack of evidence for

prestatutory use of the above-named source for irrigation at the described location. Relation back to irrigation at Hot Springs Ranch is not valid because the use of water from Jersey Hot Spring "F" for irrigation at Home Station Ranch was not pursued with reasonable diligence. *See*, Sections III and V for further discussion of irrigation.

Proof of Appropriation V-05761 was filed on June 30, 1992, by Jerry Kelly, claiming a vested right from Jersey Hot Spring for irrigation of 240 acres of alfalfa and diversified pasture within Section 7 of T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M. with a priority date of 1878, and 40 acres within Section 12 of T.26N., R.39E., M.D.B.&M. with a priority date of 1900. This proof was amended multiple times by current owners Mike and Barbara Stremler with the final amendment filed December 16, 2013, for irrigation of 127.55 acres of alfalfa within Section 7 of T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M. with a priority date of 1872. This proof has the identical source, place of use, duty, owner, priority date, and supporting documentation as V-01933. This proof is denied for lack of evidence for prestatutory use of the above-named source for irrigation at the described location. Relation back to irrigation at Hot Springs Ranch is not valid because the use of water from Jersey Hot Spring "F" for irrigation at Home Station Ranch was not pursued with reasonable diligence. *See*, Sections III and V for further discussion of irrigation.

Proof of Appropriation V-10012 was filed on November 29, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremler claiming a vested right from Spring C in the Jersey Hot Spring Complex for irrigation of 127.55 acres of alfalfa within Section 7 of T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M. An amended proof was filed December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for irrigation from the above-named source is denied. There are no existing structures that support the diversion of water from Spring C to the pipeline that routes water from Jersey Spring "F" to Home Station Ranch. There is also a lack of evidence that supports the prestatutory use of water from Spring C at Home Station Ranch. Relation back to irrigation at Hot Springs Ranch is not valid because the use of water from Spring C for irrigation at Home Station Ranch was not pursued with reasonable diligence. *See*, Sections III and V for further discussion of irrigation.

Proof of Appropriation V-10016 was filed on November 29, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremler, claiming a vested right from Butcher Canyon Creek for irrigation of 127.55 acres of alfalfa within Section 7 of T.26N., R.40E., M.D.B.&M. An amended proof was filed December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, a vested right for irrigation from the above-named source is denied. Historical records and maps show a ditch existed from an earthen dam structure at the mouth of Butcher Canyon to Jersey Spring "F". The washed-out dam structure was identified during field investigations conducted by staff of the Office of the State Engineer. Currently, there are no existing structures that support the diversion of water from Butcher Canyon to Jersey Spring "F". There is also a lack of evidence that supports the prestatutory use of water from Butcher Canyon at Home Station Ranch. Relation back to irrigation at Hot Springs Ranch is not valid because the use of water from Butcher Canyon for irrigation at Home Station Ranch was not pursued with reasonable diligence. *See*, Sections III and V for further discussion of irrigation.

Proofs of Appropriation V-09982, V-09983, V-09984, V-09985, V-09986, V-09987, V-09988, V-09989, V-09990, V-09991, V-09992, V-09993, V-09994, V-09997, V-10020, V-10021, V-10022, V-10023, V-10024, V-10025, and V-10026 were filed on October 6, 2010, by Mike and Barbara Stremmer claiming vested rights from spring sources for stock watering of 7,000 head of cattle and 33,000 sheep. Amended proofs were filed on December 16, 2013, changing the priority date to 1872. The claimant has not run livestock on these spring sources since the 1971 grazing allotment boundary agreement was approved, nor are the Stremmers the current authorized Bureau of Land Management (BLM) grazing allotment holder. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, vested rights for stock watering described under the above-named proofs are denied. *See*, Sections III and V for further discussion of stock watering.

Proof of Appropriation V-10000 was filed on October 20, 2010, by Bert Paris claiming a vested right from Wildcat Gap Spring (a.k.a. Moses Spring #3) for stock watering of 478 head of cattle. The claimant is the current authorized Bureau of Land Management (BLM) grazing allotment holder for the Cottonwood allotment. No chain of title documenting the claimant as successor in interest to prestatutory water use was provided to support this claim. Therefore, in this Preliminary Order of Determination a vested right for stock watering described under the above-named proof is denied. *See*, Sections III and V for further discussion of stock watering.

Proofs of Appropriation V-10040 and V-10041 were filed on January 28, 2011, by Joe Saval Co., LLC claiming a vested right from Lower Cedar Spring and Cedar Spring, respectively, for stock watering of 500 head of cattle and 5,000 sheep. The claimant has not run livestock on these spring sources since the 1971 grazing allotment boundary agreement was approved, nor is the Joe Saval Co., LLC the current authorized Bureau of Land Management (BLM) grazing allotment holder. In this Preliminary Order of Determination, vested rights for stock watering described under the above-named proofs are denied. *See*, Sections III and V for further discussion of stock watering.

IX. CHANGES TO WATER RIGHTS DETERMINED IN THIS PROCEEDING

All water rights established under this adjudication shall be appurtenant to the place of use designated herein, pursuant to NRS § 533.040. Any water user desiring to change the point of diversion, manner of use or place of use of the water rights established herein must make application to the State Engineer for permission to make a change pursuant to NRS § 533.325 and 533.345.

The amount of water under a proposed change application shall not exceed the amount of water available at the source for beneficial use. For streams or springs without sufficient data to accurately represent actual runoff characteristics and volumes, the State Engineer may require additional information prior to the approval or denial of any change application. The amount of water allowed to be changed shall not exceed the duty of water as decreed under the terms and conditions of this adjudication proceeding, and may be limited to the consumptive use.

Existing permitted and certificated rights that are superceded by vested claims are subject to being voided upon finalization of the decree. Voiding of existing permitted or certificated rights will occur if the State Engineer determines the permit or certificate to be redundant to a decreed water right.

X. AVAILABLE WATERS

The State Engineer determines that the streams and springs named herein are fully appropriated under the claims of vested rights determined to be valid in this proceeding and/or under existing permits and certificates issued by the State Engineer, with the exception of Jersey Hot Spring "F". *See*, Section IX, Proofs V-01933 and V-05761 for discussion of Jersey Hot Spring "F". For all other sources of surface water within the area subject to this adjudication, there is no surplus water in an average year for any additional consumptive uses.

Then running northwest for 2 miles to a point in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ section 32, T. 27 N., R. 40 E. above the junction of the Jersey Valley and Rock Corral roads. Then turning in a southwesterly direction to the quarter corner common to sections 32 and 33, T. 26 N., R. 39 E. Then continuing in a southwesterly direction to a point half way between the south fence around Section 6, T. 29N, R. 39 E and the Lower Ranch fence in Section 7, T. 25 N., R. 39 E. Then turning northwest at this point and going 6.3 miles to the power line road in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 29, T. 26 N., R. 38 E. From this point running in a southwesterly direction for approximately 3.6 miles to the ridge just south of Old Man Canyon (NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 34, T. 26 N., R. 37 E., unsurveyed). Thence west up this ridge approximately 1.6 mile to the Pleasant Valley-Buffalo Valley grazing unit boundary.

Joe Saval Estate will make all of their N-2 and N-6 use north of the line.

Manuel Chabango will make all of his N-2 Buffalo Valley Unit use north of the line.

DeMar H. and Joa A. Dahl will make all of their N-2 and N-6 use south of the line.

Paul Engle Ranches, leased to Sheldon Lamb, will make all of their N-2 use south of the line.

M. L. Investment Co. will make all of their N-2 and N-6 use south of the line.

Ellison Ranching Co. will make 595 AUMs of their N-6 use north of the line and 903 AUMs of use on the south side of the line.

Special Conditions

1. Sheep use south of the division line - Until such a time that further division of the range is necessary, Ellison Ranching Co. will restrict their use to that area east of Cottonwood Creek. M. L. Investment Co. will restrict their sheep use to that area west of Cottonwood Creek. This is in accord with Ellison Ranching Co. and M. L. Investment Co. customary use in the Fish Creek Grazing unit. Ellison Ranching Co. will continue to make their customary use in the Bridges Hills area of the Fish Creek Unit south of the Cottonwood area.
2. Water will be developed in Cedar Canyon and piped across the line to provide yearlong livestock water on both sides of the line.
3. Livestock water will be provided on both sides of the line at McCoy Spring and Sou Hot Springs. The main hot spring at McCoy Spring will be left on the west side of the fence with a water line to the irrigation ditch for livestock water on the east side.

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
