
RE: JERRETT AND NIAGARA CREEKS, } ORDER

TO: George G. Knowles and E. A. Knowles,
also known as Knowles Bros.

You are making an unauthorized and illegal use of the waters of Niagara Creek on two specific counts hereinafter set forth:

- (1) You have made a change in the point of diversion, manner and place of use of a portion of the waters of Niagara Creek without having complied with the Water Law, (Sec. 4, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913 and Sec. 59, Chapter 59, Statutes of 1919).
- (2) You are irrigating approximately 60 acres of land in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$, SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$, NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ and W $\frac{1}{2}$ W $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 12, T. 40 N., R. 52 E. which has no evidence of any existing water right, (Sec. 2, Chapter 140, Statutes of 1913; Sec. 59, Chapter 59, Statutes of 1919).

You are hereby ordered to cease your use of the waters of Niagara Creek through your recently installed pipe line until such time as you have complied with the Statutes of the State of Nevada governing the appropriation and use of waters in Nevada.
