NOTICE OF MORATORIUM

By this notice the public is advised that Lemmon Valley which also includes Golden Valley and the Black Springs area, Washoe County, is a critical groundwater area. A moratorium on the issuance of permits to appropriate the underground waters has been declared by the Nevada State Engineer.

Records in the office of the State Engineer and observations of development indicate that present and immediate future use of ground water is or will exceed the amount available as a dependable supply over an extended period of time.

All users of groundwater within the Lemmon Valley Basin who have not complied with the Nevada Water Law by obtaining a permit for water use should immediately file applications to appropriate with the Nevada State Engineer. This notice or the filing of applications to appropriate does not necessarily imply that rights will be granted for the continued or future use of groundwater.

The Nevada Water Law does not require an application to appropriate groundwater for domestic purposes only, for a single family residence, where the total amount of water does not exceed 1,800 gallons per day.

Additional investigations of the groundwater supply and use are presently being conducted.
