
You have caused a well to be drilled within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 27, T.18N., R.24E., M.D.B.&M. A field inspection by personnel of the Division of Water Resources has confirmed that this well is incomplete and constructed in an unsafe manner and further is a source of potential pollution to the ground water resource within the area. This well was drilled under the provisions of Permit 45477. Permit 45477, when issued, was for a well to be drilled within the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  NE $\frac{1}{4}$  Section 27, T.18N., R.24E., M.D.B.&M., which is a different 40-acre subdivision from where the well was actually drilled.

The provisions of NRS 533.335 and 533.360 set the statutory criteria for accurately describing and constructing the works of diversion. You have caused this well to be constructed at a location other than the one described in your application, therefore you are in violation of the provisions of the above cited statutes.

Further, NRS 534.060(4) states:

"If in the judgment of the state engineer a well is in any manner defective he may order the owner to repair the well or, in his discretion, may cause the well to be repaired or sealed. If the state engineer elects to repair or seal the well, the cost of repairing or sealing the well must be paid from the water distribution account and must not be charged to the owner of the well or be a lien on the land upon which the well is located or on other land of the owner to which water from the well is appurtenant."

This well is hereby declared defective and unsafe. You are hereby ordered to plug said well in accordance with Part 14 of the Regulations for Drilling Water Wells within five (5) days of the date of this order.
