R U L I N G

GENERAL:

Application 8555 was filed June 3, 1928 by John Krotzer, Russell Moyle and C. R. Townsend for 1.0 c.f.s. of water for mining, milling and domestic purposes. The proposed source is Roadside Spring, and is to be diverted in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 8, T. 15 N., R. 68 E., M.D.B.&M. The place of use is described as being within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 17, T. 15 N., R. 68 E., M.D.B.&M.

A letter was sent by this office by Certified Mail to the applicants on October 7, 1968, requesting additional information necessary before action could be taken on this application. A letter was received in this office October 9, 1968, by Mrs. Bessie Townsend, widow of C. R. Townsend. She stated that all three men were deceased and, as far as she knows, John Krotzer and Russell Moyle have no known survivors. She further stated that this office could take any action convenient on this application.

RULING

Application 8555 is herewith denied on the grounds the applicant or his successors in interest failed to submit the information requested regarding an intent to place the water to beneficial use and the approval of this application, without the information requested, would be detrimental to the public welfare.
