GENERAL:

Application 8875 was filed by F. R. Bowers on April 20, 1929 to appropriate 1.0 c.f.s. of water from Mayflower Spring for mining and domestic purposes. The point of diversion is described as within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 33, T. 38 N., R. 48 E., M.D.B.&M. The place of use is described as within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, T. 38 N., R. 48 E., M.D.B.&M. Protest to the granting of this application was filed by the Russell Land and Cattle Company on October 7, 1929.

Application 8876 was filed by F. R. Bowers on April 20, 1929 to appropriate 1.0 c.f.s. of water from Rock House Spring for mining and domestic purposes. The point of diversion and the place of use are described as within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 33, T. 38 N., R. 48 E., M.D.B.&M. Protest to the granting of this application was filed by the Russell Land and Cattle Company on August 1, 1929. An informal protest was filed on September 21, 1929 by the W. T. Jenkins Co. and withdrawn on November 28, 1929.

A letter was sent to the applicant on January 6, 1969 by certified mail requesting additional information necessary before further action could be taken on Application Nos. 8875 and 8876. The letter was returned by the Post Office Department marked "Unclaimed" and "Unknown". It is the responsibility of the applicant or his successors in interest to keep this office informed of his current mailing address.

RULING

Application Nos. 8875 and 8876 are herewith denied on the grounds that the applicant or his successors in interest have failed to submit additional information and the approval of these applications without the information requested would be detrimental to the public welfare.
