R U L I N G

GENERAL:

60 Applications 24766, 24~~76~~⁷ and 24768 were filed November 18, 1968, by Day Cattle Co. to appropriate 10.0 c.f.s. of water under each application from underground sources for irrigation purposes. The point of diversion under 24766 is described as being within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 31; the point of diversion under 24767 is described as being within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 32; and the point of diversion under 24768 is described as being within the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 28 all in T. 32 N., R. 49 E., M.D.B.&M. The place of use under these applications is described as 2,000 acres within portions of Sections 1, 12, 13, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27, 34, 35, 36, T. 32 N., R. 48 E., and portions of Sections 18, 19, 30 and 31, T. 32 N., R. 49 E., and Sections 36, T. 33 N., R. 48 E., M.D.B.&M.

61 These applications were protested on January 21, 1969, by Paul and Teresa Sansinena on the grounds that "Interference with our present well - State Engineer Permit 17973."

OPINION:

It is the opinion of this office that the distance between the wells under these applications and the protestant's well is sufficient to insure no interference.

RULING

The protests under Applications 24766, 24767, and 24768 are herewith overruled and permits will be issued upon receipt of statutory permit fees under these applications, subject to existing rights and with the provision that the well driller submit logs of the wells to this office for evaluation before any perforations are made in the casing.
