R U L I N G

GENERAL:

Application 8351 was filed by Mocho Brothers on October 21, 1927, for permission to appropriate 0.05 c.f.s. of water from an unnamed spring, (Mocho Spring) for stock watering purposes. The proposed point of diversion and place of use is described as within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 5, T.30N.,R.22E., M.D.B.&M.

This application was protested on December 22, 1927, by Donnelly Land and Livestock Company and R. T. Jenkins, and on December 28, 1927, by Clark's Valley Land and Sheep Company, and on January 12, 1928, by M. J. and D. Ceresola and M. P. Depaoli.

Application 8352 was filed by Mocho Brothers on October 21, 1927, for permission to appropriate 0.05 c.f.s. of water from Rodeo Creek for stock watering purposes. The proposed point of diversion and place of use is described as being within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 26, T.29N.,R.22E.,M.D.B.&M.

Protests were filed on December 22, 1927, by Donnelly Land and Livestock Co., and R. T. Jenkins, and on January 12, 1928, by W. J. and D. Ceresola and M. P. Depaoli.

Application 8353 was filed by Mocho Brothers on October 21, 1927, for permission to appropriate 0.05 c.f.s. of water from Wild Horse Canyon Springs for stock watering purposes. The proposed point of diversion and place of use is described as within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 11, T.29N.,R.21E.,M.D.B.&M.

Protests were filed December 22, 1927, by Donnelly Land and Livestock Company and R. T. Jenkins and on January 12, 1928, by W. J. and D. Ceresola, and M. P. Depaoli.

Application 8354 was filed by Mocho Brothers on October 21, 1927, for permission to appropriate 0.05 c.f.s. of water from Upper Little Rattlesnake Springs for stock watering purposes. The proposed point of diversion and place of use is described as within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 18, T.29N., R.22E.,M.D.B.&M.

Protests to this application were filed January 1, 1928, by R. T. Jenkins and Donnelly Land and Livestock Company and on January 12, 1928, by W. J. and D. Ceresola and M. P. Depaoli.

22 Application 8357 was filed by Mocho Brothers on October 21, 1927, for permission to appropriate 0.05 c.f.s of water from Fox Canyon Spring For stock watering purposes. The proposed point of diversion and place of use is described as within the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 24, T.29N., R.22E., M.D.B.&M.

Protests were filed December 22, 1927, by Donnelly Land and Livestock Company, and R. T. Jenkins and On January 12, 1928, by W. J. and D. Ceresola, and M. P. Depaoli.

27 Application 8358 was filed by Mocho Brothers on October 21, 1927, for permission to appropriate 0.05 c.f.s. of water from Jack Ass Spring for stock watering purposes. The proposed point of diversion and place of use is described as within the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 3, T.29N., R.22E., M.D.B.&M.


Letters dated April 7, 1965, and April 21, 1965, were sent to the Bureau of Land Management requesting information on the range users in the area covered by these applications. Their replies, dated April 16, 1965, April 20, 1965, and April 20, 1965, state that the Mocho Brothers do not have range rights in the area covered by these applications.

A letter dated April 27, 1965, was sent by certified mail to the applicants requesting additional information necessary before permits could be issued under these applications. This letter was returned by the Post Office Department stamped: "Unknown." It is the responsibility of the applicant or his successors in interest to keep this office informed of their current mailing address.

RULING

Applications 8351, 8352, 8353, 8354, 8357, and 8358 are herewith denied on the grounds that the applicants failed to submit the required information necessary before permits could be issued under these applications.
