RULING

Description of Application:

Application No. 9229 was filed on March 9, 1930 by R. R. Gamble to appropriate 1.0 c.f.s. of the waters of Patna Hot Springs for irrigation and domestic purposes. The point of diversion is described as being within the SE¹/₄ SW¹/₄ Section 7, T. 20 N., R. 26 E., M.D.B.&M. and the place of use is within the SE¹/₄ SW¹/₄ & SW¹/₄ SE¹/₄ Section 7, T. 20 N., R. 26 E., M.D.M.

A protest to the granting of this application was filed on August 8, 1930 by the Central Pacific Railway Company and the Southern Pacific Land Company on the grounds that the protestants are the owners of the SE¹/₄ SW¹/₄ & SW¹/₄ SE¹/₄ Section 7, T. 20 N., R. 26 E., M.D.B.&M., and that neither of said protestants has given the applicant any right or permission to enter upon said land or do any work thereon.

General:

This application has been held in abeyance since it was filed pending action by the applicant to acquire title to the land he plans to irrigate.

On July 17, 1953 the applicant was notified by registered mail that it was necessary for this office to take action on his application and that unless we heard from him within thirty days we would cancel the filing.

On July 30, 1953 the applicant requested an extension of time of one year within which to acquire title to the land in question.

On August 3, 1953 an extension of time of one year was granted by this office with the provision that there would be no further extensions of time on this application.

RULING

Application No. 9229 is herewith denied on the grounds that the applicant has not presented to this office proof of title to the land he plans to irrigate and that he has not proceeded with due diligence in acquiring title to said land.
