R U L I N G

Application 36333 was filed on December 22, 1978, by Melvin A. and Leonard D. Robison to change the place of use of 1.0 c.f.s. of underground water appropriated under Permit 35370 for quasi-municipal and domestic use.

Application 36506 was filed on January 19, 1979 by Melvin A. and Leonard D. Robison to change the place of use of 1.0 c.f.s. of underground water appropriated under Permit 35369 for quasi-municipal and domestic use.

The points of diversion under Applications 36333 and 36506 remain the same as under Permits 35370 and 35369 and are within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 10, T.16N.,R.19E., M.D.M.

The existing place of use is portions of Secs. 10 and 11, T.16N.,R.19E., M.D.M. and the proposed place of use is portions of Secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15, T.16N.,R.19E., M.D.M.

Applications 36333 and 36506 were protested on April 11, 1979 by Russ and Deborah Sheltra and Frank and Phylis Laurence. The protests noted that Applications 36333 and 36506 proposed to increase the number of units to be served from 94 to 200 which would impair the value of existing rights.

Brien B. Walters representing Melvin A. and Leonard D. Robison notified the State Engineer on April 23, 1979 that the intention of the applicants was to develop only 94 units.

Deborah Sheltra withdrew her protest on April 30, 1979 on the condition that only 94 units would be served.

RULING

The protests to Applications 36333 and 36506 are overruled and permits will be issued. The permits will be limited to a total of 94 units under both permits and the total combined duty of water under both permits must not exceed 34.3 million gallons annually.
