

IN THE MATTER OF APPLICATION NO. 17286, FILED BY ALVIN AND LUCILLE K. DELANEY TO APPROPRIATE WATER FROM AN UNNAMED SPRING IN DOUGLAS COUNTY, NEVADA. }

R U L I N G

General:

Application No. 17286 was filed on May 31, 1957, to appropriate 0.008 c.f.s. for Quasi-Municipal (Subdivision) purposes. The proposed point of diversion and place of use are within the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 25, T. 13 N., R. 18 E., M.D.B.&M.

A protest to the granting of this application was filed on September 27, 1957, by Lloyd Shellabarger.

A field investigation of this application was made on October 14, 1960. The source is a spring area located approximately 50 feet north of the Kingsbury road and flows in a south-westerly direction for approximately 150 feet where it disappears. The spring was flowing 0.008 c.f.s. and there is no contribution from this source into the Smalls' (Edgewood) Creek stream system.

RULING

The protest to the granting of Application No. 17286 is herewith overruled on grounds that its granting will not impair the value of existing rights or be otherwise detrimental to the public welfare. A permit will be issued under this application in the amount of 0.008 c.f.s. when the following requirements have been complied with:

- (a) The applicant must obtain approval of his subdivision plan from all interested State and county agencies;
- (b) The approved subdivision plan must be submitted to this office together with the statutory permit fee.
