R U L I N G

General:

This application was assigned on December 20, 1950, to Frank G. Arcularius and Howard Arcularius, and on December 30, 1951, by Frank G. and Howard Arcularius to F. H. Arcularius a one-third (1/3) interest.

119 On December 8, 1950, Monitor Livestock Company filed a protest to the granting of this application on grounds that any additional stock watering privileges in the area would result in injury to the range. The protest was withdrawn on October 15, 1951. On December 15, 1950, Jess Chance and Jess Chance, Jr., filed a protest to the granting of this application on grounds that their present existing range rights would be materially affected.

On August 11, 1960, the Bureau of Land Management in Reno, Nevada, advised this office that the granting of this application will not complicate grazing administration within the service area of this application.

RULING

The protest to the granting of Application No. 13229 is herewith overruled on grounds that its granting will not impair the value of existing grazing rights or be otherwise detrimental to the public welfare. A permit will be issued under this application on receipt of the statutory permit fee.
