RULING

**#5251**

GENERAL

I.

Application 42096 was filed on August 15, 1980, by U.C. Campbell in support of Desert Land Entry N-30764, to appropriate 5.6 cubic feet per second of water from an underground source for irrigation purposes. The proposed place of use is 320 acres described as being located within N½ of Section 23, T.13N., R.70E., M.D.B.&M. The proposed point of diversion is described as being located within NW¼ NE¼ of said Section 23.<sup>1</sup>

II.

The application was timely protested by Fredrick Baker of Baker Ranches, Inc., on the grounds that the granting of the application would conflict and interfere with existing water rights in the area.<sup>1</sup>

FINDINGS OF FACT

I.

The applicant and his agent were notified by certified mail dated March 3, 2003, to submit additional information to the State Engineer's Office and to advise this office in writing if the applicant was interested in pursuing Application 42096. The applicant was warned that failure to respond within 30 days would

result in denial of the application. The certified letter to the applicant was returned to the Office of the State Engineer by the U.S. Postal Service stamped "No Such Number." The certified letter to the agent was returned to the Office of the State Engineer by the U.S. Postal Service stamped "Attempted - Not Known" and "No Such Number."<sup>1</sup> The State Engineer finds that the applicant and his agent were properly notified of the request for additional information regarding interest in pursuing Application 42096 and have failed to respond.

**II.**

The State Engineer finds that it is the responsibility of the applicant, his agent, or his successor in interest to keep this office informed of a current mailing address.

**III.**

The State Engineer finds that there has been no correspondence from the applicant regarding Application 42096 for at least 21 years.<sup>1</sup>

**CONCLUSIONS**

**I.**

The State Engineer has jurisdiction over the parties and the subject matter of this action and determination.<sup>2</sup>

**II.**

Before either approving or rejecting an application, the State Engineer may require additional information that will enable him to properly guard the public interest.<sup>3</sup>

**III.**

The State Engineer is prohibited by law from granting a permit under an application to appropriate the public water where:<sup>4</sup>

- A. there is no unappropriated water at the proposed source;
- B. the proposed use or change conflicts with existing rights;
- C. the proposed use or change conflicts with protectible interests in existing domestic wells as set forth in NRS § 533.024; or
- D. the proposed use or change threatens to prove detrimental to the public interest.

**IV.**

The applicant and his agent were properly notified of the request for additional information concerning interest in this application and have failed to submit this information to the State Engineer's Office. The State Engineer concludes that the failure to express any interest in the application for over 21 years and failure to maintain a current mailing address demonstrates the applicant's lack of interest in pursuing Application 42096. The State Engineer concludes it would threaten to prove detrimental to the public interest to issue a permit under an application for which no interest is expressed.

Application 42096 is hereby denied on the grounds that its issuance would threaten to prove detrimental to the public interest. No ruling is made on the merits of the protest.
