NOTICE

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

You are hereby notified that all maps, plats, data and evidence heretofore collected by or filed with the State Engineer, together with the abstract of claims in the proceedings for the determination of the relative rights in and to the waters of the Humboldt River and its tributaries will be open for inspection for a period of ten days, beginning on the tenth day of June, A.D. 1916 (Sundays and legal holidays excepted) from 9 to 12 o'clock A. M., and from 1 o'clock to 4:30 o'clock P.M. each day at the office of the State Engineer at Carson City, Nevada.

It being impracticable to select one particular place for the exhibition of these data that would be convenient for all interested parties, it has been decided to fix the place at which the same shall be exhibited as the office of State Engineer, as above stated. However, in order to afford each water user an opportunity to examine such data without incurring traveling expense to and from Carson City, supplemental exhibitions will be made at the following places on the following dates:

Lovelock, at Big Meadow Hotel, ----May 15th, and 16th, 1916.
Winnemucca, at El Dorado Hotel, ---May 17th, and 18th, 1916.
Battle Mountain, at Nevada Hotel, -May 19th, and 20th, 1916.
Elko, at Mayer Hotel, -----May 22nd, and 23rd, 1916.
Lee, at Town Hall, -----May 24th, and 25th, 1916.
Lamoille, at Lamoille Hotel, -----May 26th, and 27th, 1916.
Deeth, at Deeth Mercantile Company's Store, May 29th, and 30th, 1916.

For information relative to contests, particularly as to the time within which the same must be filed, your attention is called to Sec. 29, Chap. 140, Statutes of 1913, as amended by Chap. 253, Statutes of 1915, which reads as follows:

Sec. 29. "Should any person claiming an interest in the stream system involved in the determination of relative rights to the use of water, whether claiming under vested title or under permit from the State Engineer, desire to contest any of the statements and proof of claims filed with the State Engineer by any claimant to the waters of such stream system, as herein provided, he shall, within
