O R D E R

EXTENDING THE DESIGNATED AREA OF THE LAS VEGAS
ARTESIAN BASIN

On January 10, 1941, the State Engineer, by an official order and pursuant to a petition signed by thirty-two legal appropriators of underground water in Las Vegas Valley, Clark County, Nevada, designated a described area of land as an underground artesian water basin coming under the provisions of the Underground Water Law, (Chapter 178, Nevada Statutes, 1939).

On February 29, 1944, the State Engineer, by an official order, extended the designated area.

On November 22, 1946, the State Engineer, by an official order, extended the designated area.

An order is hereby made by the State Engineer, and entered on the records of the State Engineer at Carson City, Nevada, designating that the Las Vegas Artesian Basin boundaries are further extended and are described as follows:

All of the area within the official boundary of the Las Vegas Valley Water District, and in addition thereto, the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of T. 20 S., R. 60 E., the W $\frac{1}{2}$ of T. 21 S., R. 60 E., and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of T. 22 S., R. 60 E., M.D.M.
