N., R. 42 E., bears N 55° 58' W., at a distance of 14781 feet,  
over a channel reach must be described by course and distance to a section corner

(11) Remarks The number of cattle and horses using this water vary  
seasonally and annually. The numbers in item 8 represent average  
maximum numbers.

We estimate that 3 deer and 59 antelope use this spring requiring 310

GPD of water from this source. This amount of water should be left at the source and not be available for appropriation.

Remarks BLM filed a Proof of Appropriation on Twin Valley Spring in August, 1979. The location listed on the proof is NW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 28 T. 45 N., R. 43 E., rather than NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. 28 as claimed here. Although this township was surveyed in the 1880's, the corners cannot be found and section lines were not projected by the U.S.G.S. on the Maiden Butte 7.5' topographic map. Therefore, it is difficult to positively determine which 40 acre subdivision this spring is in.
