Later a wagon road was constructed and water was used again to some extent for irrigating. In 1904 the Sugar Loaf ditch was constructed and about 5 acres was used for garden up to 1907 when it was again abandoned owing to dry years at that time and since it has not been used.

A. Water first used for irrigation in the early '70's, by a man
named Muffler or Muffley, as near as can be ascertained by claimant;

used for the irrigation of small tract in Lot 1 of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 7, Tp 42
N. R. 41 E., for garden purposes;

11. Q. State the number of acres watered each subsequent year, and give the legal subdivisions of which the water was used, and as near as may be the acres irrigated in each legal subdivision.

A. Small tract in Lot 1 of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 7, Tp 42 N. R. 41 E., was irrigated season or two, in early '70's, and abandoned for the reason, there was no wagon road to this point and the expense of marketing the vegetables was too great to make a success of the gardening; later a road was constructed, and from 1885 to 1890, land in the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 6, and Lot 1 of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 7, Tp 42 N. R. 41 E., was used as a summer dairy ranch by S.B.P. Pierce, and water was used to some extent for irrigation; from 1890 to 1904, practically nothing was done with this land, in 1904, the Sugar Loaf Ditch was constructed, and since that time about 5 acres has been irrigated during each year for a garden;

12. Q. If water is claimed for irrigation, give the legal subdivisions of land owned or controlled by you for which an appropriation is claimed.

A. Appropriation claimed by me for the irrigation of the land above described, said land being controlled by claimant;

13. Q. State the acreage said ditch is capable of watering, give the legal subdivisions of land which it can be made to irrigate, and state who owns said land.

A. This ditch, by slight enlargement, can be made to irrigate about 20 acres of land in the S $\frac{1}{2}$ of SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 6 and Lot 1 of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec 7, Tp 42 N. R. 41 E., land owned or controlled by Lorenzo Recanzone; The aforesaid 20 acres of land, lay along the stream, and water used to irrigate same, would, to a great extent, return to the stream;

A. Bottom land along the stream;
