

PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION



From Camp Valley Head Waters Name of natural water source

Frank Walker, the undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the facts relative to the appropriation of water by

John H. Hammond are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

I Frank Walker do represent John H. Hammond in this application as Attorney in fact

(1) Name of claimant John H. Hammond Address Pioche County of Lincoln State of Nevada

(2) The means of diversion employed earth Dam and Ditches Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The date of the survey of ditch, canal, or pipe line was prior to 1900

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun prior to 1900 and completed about the same time

(5) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as originally constructed were: Width on bottom two feet, width on top three feet, depth three feet, on a grade of ten feet per thousand feet.

(6) The conduit has (has not) been enlarged. NOTE-If enlargement or extension of ditch was made, supply information under (7) and (8)

(7) The work of enlargement of the ditch or canal was begun and completed

(8) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as enlarged are: Width on bottom two feet, width on top three feet, depth three feet, on a grade of ten feet per thousand feet.

(21) The character of the soil is sandy loam The soil needs three acre-feet
(Sandy, gravelly, loam)
per annum to properly irrigate the crops. A continuous flow of one cubic feet of water per second, during the irrigation season of 4 months, is needed to irrigate each 100 acres of land.
