PROOF OF THE APPROPRIATION OF WATER.

State your name Nevada and California Land and Live Stock Company, a corporation.

1. Q. Postoffice.

A. Post office Box 163, Reno, Nevada.

2. Q. State the use to which the water has been applied.

A. Domestic uses and watering live stock.

3. Q. State the means of diversion employed.

4. Q. If through a ditch state its name.

5. Q. (a) State date of survey of the ditch or other distributing works through which the water claimed is diverted. (b) The date when the construction of such ditch was begun and when completed.

A. (a) Diversion of said waters was begun and completed prior (b) to January 1, 1899.

6. Q. If any enlargements were made state the date when begun and the date when completed.

7. Q. State dimensions of the ditch as originally constructed, and as enlarged. Diversion pipe was placed in position by digging a trench from A. two to seven feet in depth, fifty feet in length, housing the entrance and discharge ends with stone and filling trench over pipe with stone and earth.

8. Q. State the name of person, association of persons or corporation who built the ditch or canal, and the name or names of its present owners.

A. Original constructors and owners Geo. Frazier and Scott Lee. Present owner--Nevada and California Land and Live Stock Company.

9. Q. State the nature of your title to the land for which an appropriation is claimed, and if not owned by you give the name of the owner and the nature of the possessory right which you exercise.

A. Land unsurveyed, government domain; possessory rights by occupancy, Company owning and maintaining thereon a House for their men and corralls for the handling of stock.

10. Q. State the year when water was first used for irrigation or other beneficial purposes, and by whom. If for irrigation, give the number of acres watered the first year, with the legal subdivisions on which the water was used, and as near as may be the acres irrigated in each legal subdivision.

A. Waters were first used for beneficial purposes prior to January 1, 1899, by George Frazier and Scott Lee, and the present claimant and its grantors have been in the possession and use thereof since said date.

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11. Q. State the number of acres watered each subsequent year, and give the legal subdivisions on which the water was used, and as near as may be the acres irrigated in each legal subdivision.

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The accompanying plat of unsurveyed Twp. 26 North, Range 26 East, M.D.M., shows approximate location of said waters, being the same commonly known by the public as Blue Wing Spring.

20. Q. Have you had sufficient water each year since the use for which an appropriation is claimed began? If not, state the years of scarcity, the months when the supply was insufficient, and the reason of such scarcity.

A. Water has been sufficient for the purposes used, but no surplus.

the undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the statements herein contained relative to the appropriation of water by Nevada California Land & Live Stock Co. are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

Proof is made by affiant as Secretary of Claimant and under authority of its Board of Directors

(1) Name of claimant Nevada California Land & Live Stock Company Address Reno, County of Washoe, State of Nevada

(2) The means of diversion employed is iron pipe 1 inch in dia. 50 feet long Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The water is impounded in 4 wooden troughs Troughs, reservoirs, tanks, etc.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun and completed prior to January 1, 1899

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is possession right by occupancy, the land being Government land and unsurveyed

(6) The claimant's water right was (was not) recorded in the office of the County Recorder of County, at page of Book of

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant during the first year was and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of days during each of the following months

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by claimant in subsequent years was as follows: and its predecessors in interest about 20,000 head of sheep and about 500 head of horses and cattle

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been 4

gallons per minute ^{.0085 cfs ft} cubic feet per second:
40 miners inches equals 1 cubic foot per second

(10) The water is diverted from its source at 8 3/8 miles west and 8 7/8 miles south feet
True bearing to nearest 5 minutes distance
from the Common corner of Section —, T. 27+28 N., R. 27+28,
E., Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.

NOTE—Information under (10) must invariably be given when a public corner is within 6 miles, unless the State Engineer consents to some other form of description.

(11) The works are located at said Spring
Describe as within a 40 acre subdivision of public survey or by a tie in same manner as under (10)

November 27, 1910


