PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR STOCK WATERING PURPOSES

From Juniper Spring Name of natural water source. Through Edward Halpe Name of ditch, pipe line, etc.

the undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the statements herein contained relative to the appropriation of water by Nevada & California Land & Live Stock Co. are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

Proof is made by affiant as Secretary of Claimant and under authority of its Board of Directors

(1) Name of claimant Nevada & California Land & Live Stock Company Address Reno County of Washoe State of Nevada

(2) The means of diversion employed is Iron pipe, 1" diameter, 50' long Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The water is impounded in 4 wooden tanks about 50 feet from spring Troughs, reservoirs, tanks, etc.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun prior to 1899 and completed in 1899, and additional work done in 1906

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is Land is unencumbered government land. Claimant has possessory rights by occupancy

(6) The claimant's water right was (was not) recorded in the office of the County Recorder of County, at page of Book of

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant during the first year was and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of days during each of the following months Number not known

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by claimant in subsequent years was as follows: and its predecessors in interest that is, during the past ten or twelve years, and including the present year, 1911; about 20,000 head of sheep and about 500 head of horses and cattle

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been four
gallons per minute 008 Sec. Ft.
40 miners inches equals 1 cubic foot per second cubic foot per second

(10) The water is diverted from its source at 1 1/8 miles west & 3/8 mile south feet
Common to corner of Section to T. 27 1/2 N, R. 27 1/2 E
E., Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.
True bearing to nearest 5 minutes distance

Note—Information under (10) must invariably be given when a public corner is within 6 miles, unless the State Engineer consents to some other form of description.

(11) The works are located at or near the Spring above described
Describe as within a 40 acre subdivision of public survey or by a tie in same manner as under (10)

Remarks:

It is not practicable to give a more definite description of the position of said spring. The position above given is from an actual survey completed November 27, 1910. Reference is hereby made to the original proof of appropriation and map filed in the above matter in the office of the State Engineer, December 8, 1910, for a more particular description of developments and improvements made at said spring. Said spring is commonly and well known as Juniper Spring.

A. Original constructors and owners Geo. Frazier and Scott Lee.

Present owner Nevada and California Land and Live Stock Company.

A. Land unsurveyed Government domain. Possessory rights by occupancy. Company owning and maintaining thereon a house for their men and corralls for the handling of stock.

10. Q. State the year when water was first used for irrigation or other beneficial purposes, and by whom. If for irrigation, give the number of acres watered the first year, with the legal subdivisions on which the water was used, and as near as may be the acres irrigated in each legal subdivision.

A. Use of the waters is continuous through entire year.

20. Q. Have you had sufficient water each year since the use for which an appropriation is claimed began? If not, state the years of scarcity, the months when the supply was insufficient, and the reason of such scarcity.

A. Water has been sufficient for the purposes used, but no surplus.

Remarks:

The accompanying plat of unsurveyed Twp 27 North, Range 26 East, M.D.M., shows approximate location of said waters, being the same commonly known by the public as Juniper Spring.

Diversion made through iron pipe, one inch in diameter, length 50 feet, conveying waters to four wooden tanks connected by overflow pipe one into the other. Quantity of water discharged through diversion pipe four gallons per minute.
