Remarks: Diligent search was made for sec. cors. but the nearest cor. that could be found was the SE. cor. of sec. 34, T. 4S., R. 66E., M.D. B. and M. Chalk and Colburn Springs were tied to this cor. It was impracticable to make such tie from Grassy and Oak Springs. They were therefore tied to U. S. M. M. No. 1. at Delamar, Nevada.

The water at each spring was measured by a vessel of known capacity and time noted for filling same.



(2) The means of diversion employed is tunnels, Ditches, open cuts, & Iron pipe.

(3) The water is impounded in Troughs, reservoirs, tunnels, & tanks.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun before the year 1895, and completed before 1902.

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is Possessory claim, the land being unsurveyed.

(6) The claimant's water right ~~was~~ (was not) recorded in the office of the County Recorder of County, at page of Book of

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant during the first year was 150 head and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of every days during each of the following months April, May, June, July, August, September, October, and November.

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by claimant in subsequent years was as follows: from one hundred and fifty head to three hundred head of cattle and horses.

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been from 1/40

to 2/40 <sup>40 miners inches equals 1 cubic foot per second</sup> cubic feet per second, for each spring amount varies at different seasons.

(10) The water is diverted from its source at the several springs, on unsurveyed land except Oak, Colburn & Chalk Situate <sup>to nearest 5 minutes distance</sup> in ~~from the~~ corner of Section ~~-----~~, T. 4, S., R. 65 & 66, E. the other springs would be in T. 5 S. R. 65 & 66 East. ~~Ex~~ Mount Diablo Base and Meridian. Reference is here made to Plat filed in office of State Engineer with Application NO. 798 for a further description of location of said Springs.

(11) The works are located at the several springs. Describe as within a 40 acre subdivision of public survey or by a tie in same manner as under (10)

Remarks: Location and Improvements; Colburn Spring is situate about six miles westerly from the Conaway dwelling house and about two miles North of the 1st Standard parallel South M. D. B. & M. in Lincoln County Nevada, and the development on the same was made prior to 1895, and consists of a dam 20 ft. long 6 in high and open cut 30 ft long. Chalk Spring is situate about one mile south of the Colburn Spring and about one mile North of the 1st standard parallel S. in said Lincoln CO. development Dam, and cut 4 X 6 X 3 ft deep with cut 10 ft. long. Willow Spring is situate about 5 miles Southwesterly from Colburn Spring on unsurveyed land would be in T. 5 S. R. 65 E. if survey was extended and is about 6 miles easterly from Grassy Spring on the Delamar Road. Development, open cut 10ft long 3 ft wide and 16 in deep. Balm Gilead Spring is situate about four miles S. of Colburn Spring, and about 2 miles S. of the 1st Standard Parallel S. and about 8 miles West of Meauow Valley Wash would be in T. 5 S. R. 66 E. if survey was extended, in Lincoln County, Nev., Development. Open cut 10 ft long 5ft face and four ft wide.

Grassy Spring is situate eight miles North about 20° East from the Town Of Delamar, in Lincoln County, Nevada, would be in T. 5 S. R. 64 E. if present survey was extended and is on the wagon or Stage road from Delamar to Caliente, Development 125 ft open cut, tunnel 8ft long, 120 ft Iron piping and three wooden troughs or tanks.

Oak Spring is situate on the stage road from Delamar to Caliente, in Lincoln County, Nevada, about one mile due East from the junction of the Cliff spring and Caliente wagon Road, and is situate about a mile north of the center of T. 4 S. R. 65 East M. D. B. & M. and about 6 miles North easterly from Grassy Springs. Development open cut 150 ft. long, tunnel 80 ft long 140 ft. of 2 in pipe, and three large wooden troughs or tanks.

Affiant further says I have used all of the waters rising in and flowing from or standing in said springs and each of them herein mentioned continuously for more than 20 years last past, for watering my horses and cattle running on my range, and I have developed the same at my own sole cost and expense at the times herein stated, and have held, claimed and used said springs and the water therefrom under a claim or ownership and right, and my possession was never disputed by anyone, nor is it now disputed by anyone.
