PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR STOCK WATERING PURPOSES

From Ash Creek Spring
Through Ash Creek Spring Reservoir
Jas. P. Wilson, the undersigned, being first

duly sworn, deposes and says that the statements herein contained relative to the appropriation of water by James Wilson and Geo. T. A. Wilson are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

This affidavit is made by James Wilson on behalf of himself and co-partner and co-claimant Geo. T. A. Wilson

(1) Name of claimant James Wilson and Geo. T. A. Wilson
Address Wilson's Ranch via Arden, County of Clark
State of Nevada

(2) The means of diversion employed is Ash Creek

(3) The water is impounded in spring and stream by dam and reservoir

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun in the year 1887 and completed in the year 1887

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is unentered government land

(6) The claimant's water right ~~was~~ (was not) recorded in the office of the County Recorder of _____ County, at page _____ of Book _____ of _____

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant during the first year was 800 and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of 360 days during each of the following months each month of the year

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by claimant in subsequent years was as follows: a band of cattle ranging from 500 to 800 head.

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been one
miners inch cubic feet per second.
40 miners inches equals 1 cubic foot per second

(10) The water is diverted from its source at about 700 ft S. W. 400
True bearing to nearest 5 minutes distance
from the N. E. corner of Section 7-, T. 21 S., R. 58,
E., Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.

NOTE—Information under (10) must invariably be given when a public corner is within 5 miles, unless the State Engineer consents to some other form of description.

(11) The works are located at Sec 1, T. P. 21 S., Range 58 E. M. D. M.
Describe as within a 40 acre subdivision of public survey or by a tie in same manner as under (10)

Remarks: This spring arises in rocky ground and
flows about one half mile and then ^{water} sinks
and disappears. Claimants have had band of
cattle on the range using this spring since
about the year 1887, operating as James B. Wilson
and Sons, but since death of James B. Wilson
in 1906 claimants have maintained cattle on
the same range and using waters from this
spring as Wilson Bros. Wilson Bros. cattle
are and have been the only cattle on this range
or using this spring. No means of diversion
other than keeping spring ^{and stream} clear of
brush is employed or necessary. The
spring has been dug out and cleaned out in 1887 and almost
every year thereafter, and dam of loose rock and gravel
renewed whenever necessary. At least one miners' inch
is used by the cattle of claimants
