PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR STOCK WATERING PURPOSES

J. C. Pagnoni, the undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the statements herein contained relative to the appropriation of water by him are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

(2) The means of diversion employed is Pipe lines
(3) The water is impounded in three Reservoirs and one iron tank and two wooden troughs
Troughs, reservoirs, tanks, etc.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun in 1906 and completed the same year, but two of the springs have been used by claimant for watering stock since 1900.

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is Possessory

(6) The claimant's water right was (was not) recorded in the office of the County Recorder of County, at Page of Book of

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant during the first year was over 75, and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of 335 days during each of the following months of the year. The animals were ranging in the vicinity and watered also at Portuguese Spring and it is not probable that they all watered at Sand Springs during each day of the year.

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by claimant in subsequent years was as follows:

The number has varied from about 100 to as much as 200 during the years from 1900 to 1906. Since 1906 the number has been between 200 and 300 more or less.

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been

one-fourth of a cubic foot per second from two of the springs and ^{40 miners inches equals 1 cubic foot per second} about one-hundred sixtieth of a cubic foot per second from the third of

(10) The water is diverted from each of the Springs. The two larger springs are situated about 200 feet apart, ^{on unwatered land} and bear approximately South 32 degrees 45-minutes West about twelve miles distant from what is known as the Big Warm Spring located near Duckwater in said Inye County. The third and smaller spring is about a mile southeasterly from the other two.

The Big Warm Spring above mentioned is situated in the NW 1/4 of Section 32 T. 13 N. R. 56 E., M. D. B. & M.

The three Sand Springs are located in Sand Spring Valley in Inye County, and are the only Springs in that valley with the exception of
