PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR
STOCK WATERING PURPOSES.

From PANCAKE SPRING (Sometimes known as and called Sulphur Spring)
Through Pancake Spring pipe line.

J. C. Tognoni, the undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the statements herein contained relative to the appropriation of water by himself and his predecessors are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

(1) Name of claimant J. C. Tognoni.

Address Duckwater, County of Nye, State of Nevada.

(2) The means of diversion employed is Pipe Lines.

(3) The water is impounded in a reservoir and a wooden trough.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun in 1902 and completed in 1903.

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is Possessory.

(6) The claimant's water right was not recorded in the office of the County Recorder.

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the predecessor of claimant during the first year was 45, and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of 365 days during the year. The animals were ranging in the vicinity and watered at other springs as well as Pancake Spring, and it is not probable that they all watered at Pancake Spring during each day of the year.

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by the predecessor of claimant in subsequent years was as follows: From forty-five to fifty during each of the years from 1902 to 1908. Claimant's predecessor who first used the water was Louis Tognoni, a brother of claimant, who died in 1905. The water was used by claimant as administrator of his said Brother's estate from 1905 to 1908, and by claimant as the heir of his brother (the property having been distributed to him by the probate court) in his own right since 1908 to the present time, during which period claimant has watered between thirty-five and fifty animals continuously at said spring.

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been 1/80 of a cubic foot per second.

(10) The water is diverted at its source at the spring, which is on unsurveyed land, and which bears approximately North 17° 40' West about twenty miles from what is known as the Big Warm Spring situate in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 32, T. 13 N., R. 56 E., M.D.B. & M., near Duckwater, in Nye County, Nevada.

(11) The works are located at the spring.
