PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR
STOCK WATERING PURPOSES.

From BUTTE STATION SPRINGS (Two Springs)

Through Butte Station Pipe Line.

J. C. Tognoni, the undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the statements herein contained relative to the appropriation of water by himself and his predecessors are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

(1) Name of claimant. J. C. Tognoni

Address Duckwater, County of Nye, State of Nevada.

(2) The means of diversion employed is pipe lines.

(3) The water is impounded in a reservoir, pipe line and tank for each spring.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun prior to 1879 and completed prior to that year for the main spring. (See remarks below)

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is Possessory.

(6) The claimant's water right was not recorded in the office of the County Recorder of Nye County.

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant during the year 1906 was 20 and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of 365 days during the year. The animals were ranging in the vicinity and watered at other springs as well as Butte Station Springs, and it is not probable that they all watered at Butte Station Springs during each day of the year.

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by claimant in subsequent years was as follows: The number has varied from as low as twenty-five to as much as sixty during each of the subsequent years to and including the year 1916. The water was first used prior to 1879 for domestic and stock watering purposes by one Pritchard and in 1879 Pritchard's right passed to one Albert, who used it from that date until about 1892 for domestic purposes and for watering from about twenty-five to approximately one hundred twenty-five animals. After Albert's death his right passed by administrator's sale to Antone Tognoni, who used the water for watering approximately one hundred head of stock down to 1906, when he sold his right to the undersigned.

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been $1/40$ of a cubic foot per second from the main spring and about $1/160$ of a cubic foot per second from the smaller spring.

(10) The water is diverted from its source at each of the springs, which are about one hundred feet apart and on unsurveyed land in Nye County, Nevada, about two miles south of the southerly line of Eureka County, and bear approximately North $33^{\circ} 45'$ West about fifteen miles from what is known as the Big Warm Spring

situate in the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Sec. 32, T. 13 N., R. 56 E., M.D.B. & M., near Duckwater, in said Nye County.

(11) The works are located at the springs.

REMARKS:

The smaller spring was developed by the undersigned in 1906 by driving a tunnel and installing a small reservoir with a pipe line and tank.
