F. R. McNamee, the undersigned, being first
 duly sworn, deposes and says that the facts relative to the appropriation of water by Lamond C.

Woods and his grantors and predecessors in interest are full and correct to the best of his
 knowledge and belief.

If proof is not made by claimant, deponent should state on this line by virtue of what authority he represents the claimant
 That claimant is now absent from the State of Nevada; that affiant is the attorney for claimant and makes this proof at the request and on behalf
 of said claimant, as the facts are within the knowledge of this affiant.

(1) Name of claimant Lamond C. Woods
 Address Jesecco, County of Lincoln
 State of Nevada.

(2) The means of diversion employed Ditch.
Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The date of the survey of ditch, canal, or pipe line was 1869.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun 1869
 and completed 1870.

(5) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as originally constructed were: Width on bottom 1 1/2
 feet, width on top 2 1/2 feet, depth 1 1/2 feet, on a grade of 10 feet per thousand feet.

(6) The conduit ~~has~~ (has not) been enlarged.

(7) The work of enlargement of the ditch or canal was begun _____

(8) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as enlarged are: Width on bottom _____ feet, width on

(9) The claimant is ~~owner~~ an owner in the above-described conduit.

(11) Crops of alfalfa, timothy, wheat, barley, oats, corn, potatoes, garden
 truck, and wild hay
 have been grown upon the land irrigated.

(12) The water has been used for irrigation from March 1 to November 15
Day of month Day of month
 of each year, and all of each year for stock watering and domestic uses.

(13) The water was first used for irrigation by claimant or his grantors in the year 1869
 when 80.1 acres were irrigated in the N. 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Sec. 13 and the SW 1/4 of
 T. 5 S., R. 62 E., M. D. B. & M.
 the NW 1/4 of Section 13; and the S 1/2 of the
 NE 1/4 and the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 and the S 1/2 of the NW 1/4, and the N 1/2
 of the SW 1/4 of Section 14; all in T. 5 S., R. 62 E., M. D. B. & M.

That is to say:

- 9 acres in the NE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 13;
- 21 acres in the NW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 13;
- 1.5 acres in the SW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 13;
- 2.4 acres in the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 14;
- 20.6 acres in the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 14;
- 10 acres in the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 14;
- 2 acres in the SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 14;
- 1.5 acres in the NW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 14;

(19) The map provided by the State Engineer and attached hereto as part of this proof is hereby accepted as correctly showing the ditch lines or irrigation works diverting or conveying the water claimed and the lands irrigated.

(20) Water from the source given and through the works described is also used for the following purposes other than irrigation: Watering of stock and domestic uses.

(21) The character of the soil is gravelly loam The soil needs acre-feet
(Sandy, gravelly, loam)
per annum to properly irrigate the crops. A continuous flow of two cubic feet of water per second, during the irrigation season of 3 1/2 months, is needed to irrigate each 100 acres of land.

(22) Remarks: The settlement of Clover Valley was originally
made by Lyman Lafayette Woods, father and predecessor in interest
of this claimant, during the year 1869, and practically all of
Clover Valley was irrigated from what is known as the East Springs,
rising and flowing from the East Fork of Clover Valley Creek. The
settlement of Clover Valley consisted of several families, and the
lands were parceled out in fields and lots before the same were
subdivided into legal subdivisions by U. S. survey, and the rights
to the use of the water attached to small lots and portions of
legal subdivisions as the same were defined by fence enclosures.
