(22) Remarks: I do not know definitely when the land was first irrigated from Cotton-wood Creek. From the best information that I can obtain Mr. Nichole was using the land that I now own in the year 1875. The official map filed in the Land Office that was made in the year 1882 shows that at that time Mr. Nichols was living there at that time and that he had approximately 50 acres of meadow that was irrigated from Cotton-wood Creek.
