Remarks:

This spring was first used by Charles H. Odgers in 1900 for watering his sheep and cattle and who sold his range and land to Casten Olsen who then sold the same range and land to this claimant in 1906, and this spring has been used by this claimant exclusively for watering his sheep ever since.

Each year the claimant has cleaned out the spring and repaired the dam and reservoir so as to make it a better place and better suited for the purpose of watering his sheep.

This spring is one of a series of small springs and while none of them are sufficient to water a large herd of sheep, by combining them and ranging the sheep from one to the other, sufficient water is obtained to water a good sized herd.
