PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR
STOCK WATERING PURPOSES

From George Rogers Spring
Name of natural water course

Through Pipe line, 75 feet long, from well by pump.
Name of ditch, pipe line, etc.

Alexander J. Mackie, the undersigned, being first
duly sworn, deposes and says that the statements herein contained relative to the appropriation of
water by him and his predecessors in interest are full and correct to the
best of his knowledge and belief.

If proof is not made by claimant, deponent should state on this line by virtue of what authority he represents the claimant

(1) Name of claimant Alexander J. Mackie
Address Caliente, County of Lincoln,
State of Nevada.

(2) The means of diversion employed is well, pump and pipe line.
Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The water is impounded in troughs new; originally in pond.
Troughs, reservoirs, tanks, etc.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun in 1899
and completed in 1899; reconstruction since necessitated by washouts.

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is: Purchase
by James Henrie from Allen Nelson in 1908, and purchase by claimant
from Henrie & Thiriot in 1920.

(6) The claimant's water right was (was not) recorded in the office of the County Recorder of
County, at Page of Book of

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant's ^{predecessors} during the first year was unknown,
and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of thirty days during each
of the following months January to December, inclusive, being used as a
watering station in connection with stage line to Delamar by Allen
Nelson, who is now dead.

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by ^{predecessors} claimants in subsequent years was as follows:
since 1909, about 1500 head of sheep during Fall and Spring until 1914, when floods filled up well and troughs. Thereafter, in 1914, cement tank and troughs were installed at Klondike, about one-fourth mile distant. In summers of 1915, 1916 and 1917, bunch of bucks was watered jointly at Klondike and George Rogers, and George Rogers water has been used every year since 1899 for culinary purposes.

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been about 0.025 ($1/40$) cubic feet per second.
40 miners inches equals 1 cubic foot per second

(10) The water is diverted from its source at $S. 54^{\circ} 13' W. 23,055$ feet from the West side common corner of Section 18 - 19, T. 2.S., R. 67 E., Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.
True bearing to nearest 5 minutes distance

Note—Information under (10) must invariably be given when a public corner is within 5 miles, unless the State Engineer consents to some other form of description.

(11) The works are located at point of diversion, on unsurveyed land.
Describe as within a 40-acre subdivision of public survey or by a tie in same manner as under (10)

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
