duly sworn, deposes and says that the statements herein contained relative to the appropriation of water by The Adams-McGill Company are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

(1) Name of claimant The Adams-McGill Company

(2) The means of diversion employed is dam and pipe
Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The water is impounded in 100 feet of iron troughs
Troughs, reservoirs, tanks, etc.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun 1892
and completed 1921

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is this is United States Government land

(6) The claimant's water right ~~was~~ (was not) recorded in the office of the County Recorder of _____ County, at Page _____ of Book _____ of _____

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant during the first year was 300, and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of 200 days during each of the following months April to November

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by claimant in subsequent years was as follows:
there are now about 2,500 sheep and 300 cattle watering at
this spring from May 1st to November 1st of each year

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been
 $\frac{1}{10}$ cubic feet per second.

40 miners inches equals 1 cubic foot per second

(10) The water is diverted from its source at $N 18^{\circ} 30' W$, 8,150 feet from
True bearing to nearest 5 minutes distance
the southeast corner corner of Section 33, T. 12N, R. 63 E,
Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.

NOTE—Information under (10) must invariably be given when a public corner is within 6 miles, unless the State Engineer consents to some other form of description.

(11) The works are located at $NW\frac{1}{4}$ of $SE\frac{1}{4}$, Sec 28, T 12N, R 63E
Describe as within a 40-acre subdivision of public survey or by a tie in same manner as under (10)

Remarks: The water of this spring was originally run into wooden
troughs through a pipe. In September, 1921, we developed more
water and have connected the spring to 100 feet of galvanized
iron troughs 20 inches in diameter by means of 60 feet of $1\frac{1}{2}$
inch iron pipe. This spring has been used continuously by
The Adams-McGill Company and its grantors from 1892 to the
present time.
