This proof is made to complete title to water for lands omitted from Application No. 474 and the map filed under # 474 is made a part hereof.

The full 194.02 acres should have dated from 1883 but 148.8 acres has completed title under permit No. 474 and this proof completes the remaining 45.22 acres
