PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR STOCK WATERING PURPOSES

From Three Small Springs (unnamed)

....., the undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the statements herein contained relative to the appropriation of water by my predecessor in interest are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

If proof is not made by claimant, deponent should state on this line by virtue of what authority he represents the claimant

(2) The means of diversion employed is by a small reservoir.
Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The water is impounded in a reservoir 50 ft. long by 20 ft. wide.
Troughs, reservoirs, tanks, etc.

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun in the year 1898
and completed in the year 1904.

(5) The nature of the claimant's title to the land upon which the works are located is the land unsurveyed public domain, NE 1/4 of SW 1/4 Sec. 9, T. 22 N. R. 42 E., 11 M.D.B. & M.

(6) The claimant's water right ~~was~~ (was not) recorded in the office of the County Recorder of ----- County, at Page ---- of Book ---- of -----

(7) The approximate number of animals watered by the claimant during the first year was 25, and said watering was conducted for an approximate period of 30 days during each of the following months all the year.

(8) The approximate number of animals watered by claimant in subsequent years was as follows:

Thirty to forty head, first year, and this number increased to 100 head or more that took water every other day.

(9) The amount of water which it has been necessary to divert for the said purpose has been $1/40$ cubic feet per second.

40 miners inches equals 1 cubic foot per second

(10) The water is diverted from its source at _____ feet from the Springs in the NE ¹/₄ SW corner of Section 9, T. 22 N., R. 42 E., Mount Diablo Base and Meridian.

True bearing to nearest 5 minutes distance

NOTE—Information under (10) must invariably be given when a public corner is within 6 miles, unless the State Engineer consents to some other form of description.

(11) The works are located at ~~Have no works, haul water in barrels.~~

Describe as within a 40-acre subdivision of public survey or by a tie in same manner as under (10)

Remarks: The water covered by this proof of appropriation is from three small springs which have been dug out from time to time for the purpose of watering horses and cattle. A small reservoir 50 feet long by 20 feet wide has been made to impound the water for this purpose. Domestic use also has been made from one of the springs. It is my purpose another year to open up the springs to bed-rock and thus to develop more water if possible. This additional water if obtained will be used in part for mining purposes and the reservoir described above will be enlarged. At present the flow of water is insufficient for all the purposes desired.
