 PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION

From The "Pines" or Donohue Creek and from the Camp Valley Creek:  
Name of natural water source

Through Two small ditches from the "Pines" Creek and one small ditch from the Camp Valley Creek.  
Name of ditch, canal, or pipe line

Frank M. Donohue, the undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the facts relative to the appropriation of water by himself and predecessors in interest are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

If proof is not made by claimant, deponent should state on this line by virtue of what authority he represents the claimant

(2) The means of diversion employed dam and ditches from the "Pines" Creek and same from Camp Valley Creek.  
Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The date of the survey of ditch, canal, or pipe line was

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun and completed along about 1877 or earlier.

(5) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as originally constructed and maintained were: Width on bottom 11 in. to 8 in. feet, width on top 15 to 20 in. feet, depth 8 in. to 10 in. feet, on a grade of 1 foot per thousand feet.

(6) The conduit has (has not) been enlarged.

(7) The work of enlargement of the ditch or canal was begun and completed

(8) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as enlarged are: Width on bottom feet, width on top feet, depth feet, on a grade of feet per thousand feet.

The water right was held under the old law of appropriation and beneficial user.

(19) The map provided by the State Engineer and attached hereto as a part of this proof is hereby accepted as correctly showing the ditch lines or irrigation works diverting or conveying the water claimed and the lands irrigated.

(20) Water from the source given and through the works described is also used for the following purposes other than irrigation: Domestic use and the watering of livestock.

(21) The character of the soil is sandy, gravelly, and loam. The soil needs one acre-foot per annum to properly irrigate the crops. A continuous flow of cubic feet of water per second, during the irrigation season of months, is needed to irrigate each 100 acres of land.

Remarks: This property is what is known as "Camp Valley Ranch" an old claim taken up in the '70s. It is in a narrow canyon. Was surveyed at request of applicant and others, and applicant has filed a homestead entry covering the land watered by the foregoing described ditches.

Applicant files copy of a map herewith. This map was made from measurements on the ground by W. A. Pray, surveyor in charge of the surveying for township purposes, I think, in 1914, and applicant recognizes the dams and ditches to correctly marked thereon.
