~~" Commencing at the SW corner of the lot belonging to the Methodist Church and on the North line of Mission street, and running Westerly, along the North line, and parallel with Mission Street, a distance of 175 feet, more or less; thence Northerly at right angles a distance of 200 feet; thence easterly at right angles a distance of 175 feet, more or less, thence southerly at right angles a distance of 200 feet to the place of beginning.~~

~~This tract of land has been continuously irrigated by the present owner and his predecessor in title since 1879.~~
