(22) Remarks: This land located in the townsite of Gardnerville, through error of predecessors in title no claim was made to water at the time of the Chandler Findings although at that time the land was under cultivation and the water being used. The main ditch through the town runs through this property. The land has been irrigated since the building of the ditch which is believed to have been in 1879, water being used continuously during the irrigating season. The land is particularly described as being: "Beginning at a point on the left bank of the so-called Ezell ditch, one hundred and twenty-four feet, three inches westerly from the corner of the Imelli brick building running thence along said county road in a westerly direction thirty seven feet; thence North one hundred three feet; thence at an acute angle eighty-seven feet in a southerly direction to the point of beginning, together with all water and water rights, ditch and ditch rights appertaining or belonging thereto.
