(21) The character of the soil gravelly The soil needs 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ acre-feet
(Sandy, gravelly, loam)
per annum to properly irrigate the crops. A continuous flow of 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet of water per second, during the irrigation season of 7 months, is needed to irrigate each 100 acres of land.

(22) Remarks: That no proof of appropriation and beneficial use of this water was made in 1905 by the then owner of the property; that the water has been used continuously and each and every year however and without interference.
