

S. G. LAMB, the undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the facts relative to the appropriation of water by Williams Estate Company, a corporation are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

(2) The means of diversion employed 2 dams and ditch and pipe line
Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The date of the survey of ditch, canal, or pipe line was unknown, but prior to 1880

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun unknown - but prior to 1880 and completed

(5) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as originally constructed were: Width on bottom 1.0 feet, width on top 3.0 feet, depth 1.0 feet, on a grade of 5 to 70 feet per thousand feet.

(6) The conduit has ~~has not~~ been enlarged.
NOTE—If enlargement or extension of ditch was made, supply information under (7) and (8)

(7) The work of enlargement of the ditch or canal was begun Enlargement by erosion and completed

(8) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as enlarged are: Width on bottom 1 to 2 feet, width on top 3 to 5 feet, depth 1 to 2 feet, on a grade of 5 to 70 feet per thousand feet.

(10) The nature of the title to the land for which the water right is claimed is State Patent and vacant Government Land

(11) Crops of Alfalfa, Grain, Potatoes, Fruit and Garden Truck have been grown upon the land irrigated.

(12) The water has been used for irrigation from March 1 to October 15

(13) The water was first used for irrigation by claimant or its grantors in the year 1880 when 200.1 acres were irrigated in the SE 1/4 of NW 1/4; E 1/2 of SW 1/4; and SE 1/4 ~~of~~ Sec. 28 and W 1/2 of SW 1/4 Sec. 27, T., 19N., R. 37E., M. D. B. & M., and SW 1/4 of NE 1/4 and NW 1/4 of SW 1/4 of Sec. 28, T. 19 N. R. 37 E., M. D. B. & M.

(19) The map provided by the State Engineer and attached hereto as a part of this proof is hereby accepted as correctly showing the ditch lines or irrigation works diverting or conveying the water claimed and the lands irrigated.

(20) Water from the source given and through the works described is also used for the following purposes other than irrigation: *for domestic use and for watering stock throughout the year*

(21) The character of the soil is *sandy loam* (Sandy, gravelly, loam). The soil needs *4.5* acre-feet per annum to properly irrigate the crops. A continuous flow of *1.2* cubic feet of water per ^{average} second, during the irrigation season of *7 1/2* months, is needed to irrigate each 100 acres of land.

(22) Remarks: *The water supply from the source is extremely variable, ranging normally from 2 to 5 second feet in March and April but dropping to as low as 2.5/100 second foot by the end of June and still lower later in the season. It is therefore necessary to use all available water early, and as this is generally inadequate for the total area irrigated water is also brought from Cherry Creek, to the northward and mingled with Florence Creek water for irrigation of the entire area.*

The water from Florence Canyon Creek is commingled with the water from Cherry Creek and its tributary, Star Creek, making it practically impossible to segregate the area irrigated from each source. It is estimated, however, that the water supply from each creek is sufficient to take care of half of the area under irrigation. The water from this source is also used for domestic purposes throughout the year and is conveyed to the place of use through 8" concrete pipeline.
