

duly sworn, deposes and says that the facts relative to the appropriation of water by Williams Estate Company, a corporation are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

Affiant makes this proof on behalf of claimant, and is the duly authorized and appointed Secretary of Williams Estate Company, a corporation.

(1) Name of claimant Williams Estate Company  
 Address Fallen, County of Churchill

(2) The means of diversion employed Dam and Ditch  
Dam and ditch, pipe line, flume, etc.

(3) The date of the survey of ditch, canal, or pipe line was unknown

(4) The construction of the ditch or other works was begun Prior to 1880 and completed

(5) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as originally constructed were: Width on bottom 1 to 2 feet, width on top 3 to 5 feet, depth 1 to 1.5 feet, on a grade of 2 to 6.0 feet per thousand feet.

(6) The conduit has ~~has not~~ been enlarged.

(7) The work of enlargement of the ditch or canal was begun Enlarged by erosion and completed

(8) The dimensions of the ditch or canal as enlarged are: Width on bottom 1 to 3 feet, width on top 3 to 7 feet, depth 1 to 3 feet, on a grade of 2 to 6.0 feet per thousand feet.

(10) The nature of the title to the land for which the water right is claimed is State Patent and vacant Government Land

(15) The maximum acreage irrigated in any year was 200.1 acres.

(16) The water claimed has (has not) been used for irrigation each and every year since the right was initiated.

(17) The years during which no water was used for irrigation or during which the full water right was not used were 1915, 1918 and 1920 to 1926 inclusive. Water supply

(19) The map provided by the State Engineer and attached hereto as a part of this proof is hereby accepted as correctly showing the ditch lines or irrigation works diverting or conveying the water claimed and the lands irrigated.

(20) Water from the source given and through the works described is also used for the following purposes other than irrigation: Watering Stock throughout the year

(21) The character of the soil is sandy loam (Sandy, gravelly, loam). The soil needs 4.5 acre-feet per annum to properly irrigate the crops. A continuous flow of 1.00 cubic feet of water per <sup>average</sup> second, during the irrigation season of 7 1/2 months, is needed to irrigate each 100 acres of land.

(22) Remarks: The water supply from this source is extremely variable, being considerable during the early months, but dwindling to less than 1/2 second-foot frequently in June, and still lower later. There are also other lands irrigated from the source. Therefore the entire surplus flow of Cherry Creek, except during brief spring freshets, and the entire flow of Star Creek, its tributary, is diverted and mingled with water from Florence Canyon Creek for irrigation of the entire area.

The water from Cherry Creek is commingled with the water from Florence Canyon Creek making it practically impossible to segregate the area irrigated from each source. It is estimated, however, that the water supply from each creek is sufficient to take care of half of the area under irrigation.
