

- (21) The character of the soil is loam (Sandy, gravelly, loam) The soil needs 600 acre-feet per annum to properly irrigate the crops. A continuous flow of 2.00 cubic feet of water per second, during the irrigation season of 7 months, is needed to irrigate each 100 acres of land.
- (22) Remarks: Claimant and his grantors have ranged cattle over the lands listed below, which are tributary water sheds to Rodeo Creek, since 1891, and claim necessary stockwater to supply needs of number of animals said tributary watershed will support.



Due to porous character of soil and steep grade of most of land irrigated, water losses are quite heavy and considerable more water is required for thorough wetting of soil than is ordinarily necessary. Furthermore, while the full flow of the stream is not required in the early spring, the entire flow is fully utilized from about June 1st on; therefore, it is not practicable to judge the water requirements on acre-foot per season basis, but rather monthly requirements of available water should be the binding factor.
