That the first knowledge of the claimant about the water right herein
described was about the year 1894, when he visited Pete Andersen who owned

~~REMARKS~~ what was then called the Andersen or "Ctt. Ranch": that the said Andersen had
a ranch there and raised ranch products and irrigated the land; that Andersen
also had from 100 to 200 head of cattle and horses, and grazed them on some 400
acres of land located on or near the stream system and watered them at the point
herein described, That from the year 1894 down to the present time the claimant
has been familiar with the said premises and the watering of live stock there,
That Andersen sold the property to a mining company and this company leased the land
and water rights, including the stock watering right, to J. R. Schulz, in about
the year 1898, and that said Schulz watered approximately 2,000 head of sheep there
from 1898 until 1906 when claimant and Alphonse Glock leased the land and water
right and watered about 2,000 head of sheep there until 1907, when the claimant
and Glock purchased the said Andersen ranch and water rights, thereafter, to-wit,
1913, claimant purchased the Glock interest. From 1906 until the present time cla'
has watered as many as 2,000 head of sheep at the said point each and every year.
That claimant is the successor in interest of all the Andersen and Schulz rights
aforsaid.

The claimant hereby reserves the right to offer additional proofs and
testament.

I concur in the foregoing statement made by my Father. My wife Jewel and I purchased this property from my Father, L. M. Jacobsen and his wife, my Mother, Bertha H. Jacobsen, and have been operating it since we were married in January, 1940. We have used the water from the Pine Nut Creek for irrigating and livestock watering in the same manner as our predecessors, consistently.

The first knowledge I have of the "Pine Nut Ranch" was in 1938, when I visited the ranch with my husband to be, and served lunch to the men who were cutting hay. Later in 1940 when we were married I often helped my husband take equipment to the ranch and spent the day watching him cut and bale hay. I often helped tend camp to the sheep camp and saw as many as 2,000 sheep grazing the field and taking water from the creek.
