(19) Water from the source given and through the works described is also used for the following purposes other than irrigation: Stock Watering

(20) The character of the soil is gravelly (d.g.) The soil needs 1 acre-feet
(Sandy, gravelly, loam)
per annum to properly irrigate the crops. A continuous flow of 5 cubic feet of water per second, during the irrigation season of 6 months, is needed to irrigate each 100 acres of land.
