(21) Remarks: The information regarding acreages irrigated in paragraph 14 are assumed to be much the same as present day cultures. An early date of 1879, which is the date of survey of the Township Plat which shows fences and activity in these areas, is more than likely the earliest date for first culture.

Although Eureka County records show later culture dates than 1879. The date of the original occupation of the land must have been much earlier.

The undersigned, being first duly sworn, deposes and says that the facts relative to the appropriation of water by Eureka Livestock Co. are full and correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.
