The said John Krenka (grandfather) began farming the acreage described in about 1879 or 1880. Since that time the Krenka family has continued to farm and ranch the property described herein except for the portions contained in the conveyance to John Murphy in 1938.



APPENDIX TO NO. 16

In 1938, Albert Krenka, claimant's uncle, conveyed to John and Alma Murphy the following property:

T 34 N, R 60 E, Section 34 N1/2 SE1/4;
NE1/4 SW1/4; Section 35 N1/2 SW1/4
This property embraces approximately 18
acres of the cultivation shown on item
13 above.

In or about 1959, claimant, John Krenka, gave one John Murphy permission to use the water in said Spring Ditch Diversion, in order to prevent an altercation with said John Murphy, husband of Alma (Krenka) Murphy, John Krenka's first cousin. Sometime later John Krenka allowed said John Murphy to use 2 inches of the said Spring Ditch by means of a pipe diversion, again to prevent a family quarrel.

Subsequently the above-described property passed to Eileen Murdoch, the Murphy's daughter, by decree of distribution in 1977. Claimant again gave his niece, permission to use the water, again to avoid a family quarrel.

From 1979 to 1981, claimants leased from Eileen Murdoch the above-described property. During that time, claimant used the Spring Ditch water to irrigate the ground in much the same way as shown on item 13 of this proof of appropriation. In 1981, Eileen Murdoch leased the said property to one Leslie Sharp, and again to avoid a quarrel, claimants permitted the Spring Ditch water to be used on the above-described property on a temporary basis.

APPENDIX TO NO. 19

Due to fluctuation caused by the vagaries of annual water accumulation and spring recharge, it is impossible to compute flow with any accuracy. It is known that all of the available water was used every year for the irrigation of the 138 acres shown on item 13 of this application, and there was no wastage. In fact, in most years, there was insufficient water for all planned irrigation.
