The following quotations are taken from the Elko Independent and from "Nevada's Northeast Frontier", by Patterson, Ulph and Goodwin, 1969, Western Printing and Publishing Co.

"Bull Run District-The range in which the district is situated is high and snow-crowned, water cold and invigorating. Pleasant valleys surround it on the east and west, unexcelled by any country for grazing purposes. Altogether, the prospects of Bull Run are unsurpassed by any district in the state".¹ "Bull Run Valley has already proven to be one of the best grazing and farming sections in the state. Mr. Hughes, who has just returned from his ranch at the Junction of Bull Run and Independence Creeks, "says the valley is rapidly settling up with good and substantial men, and early in the spring a company will, at the mouth of Silver Creek, erect a flour mill."² "Bull Run Valley-stock in this valley is looking finely, and much stock consisting of cattle and sheep, of the latter, about 8,000 in number. Salmon have commenced their run up the Owyhee, now is the time

to salt them down for winter use. R.P. Riddle, Deputy County Surveyor, from Bull Run, called on us this week. From him, we learn the above facts relating to Bull Run."³ By the end of 1873, Elko County Rangers were fully stocked and pastures deteriorated from over grazing. With sections crowded in the winter, the situation became alarming. Settlement by small ranchers under the Pre-emption and Homestead Acts took lands that could be irrigated, thus curtailing range use. In the process of settlement, large areas of meadow grass were withdrawn from public domain and appropriated by homesteaders."⁴ "Bull Run Valley-the past winter has been fatal to stock in this vicinity, sheep being the greatest sufferers. In Bull Run Valley out of one band of 5,000 head, only about 1,200 are left, and from another band, 3,300 strong only 200 have lasted through the winter. This is true of all bands. Cattle too are dying rapidly."⁵
 We are claiming a August 3, 1872 as a date of priority.
