Remarks

The original Deadhorse Well was dug by John Murphy in 1872 to serve freight teams and livestock owned by Murphy. The well location cited on this proof is shown on the 1938 GLO survey of T.12N., R.32E., M.D.B. & M. Later it and other associated waters nearby have been important sources for the town of Rawhide. It has served as an important stockwatering location for Bell Livestock Co., Dieringers, T.O. McKinnon, Bracian Eroz, Carpenter Ranches, Stewart Elsner, W.J. Stinson and other predecessors of the original Claimants. David G. Holmgren and Jackie A. Holmgren are the successor Claimants by virtue of the chain of title on file with the State Engineer's office and are current BLM allotment holders for the Pilot-Table Mt. Allotment.





Records show that livestock numbers varied from year to year. Cattle use from about 1880 to the present has been mainly in the winter. 2000 sheep were run in 1910 and this use changed to 1000-2000 Angora goats beginning in 1923 and continuing to 1942. Sheep and cattle were run until 1976. Since then cattle have used the area.

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
