





SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION, PROOF OF APPROPRIATION OF WATER FOR IRRIGATION.

GENERAL

Claims of vested right by Donald T. and Peggy Hall to a portion of the waters of Stutler Canyon Creek are supported by information contained in a report prepared by Milton L. Sharp, P.E., State Water Right Surveyor No. 784, titled Water Rights and Water Resources Investigation, Sheridan Creek, Stutler Creek and Gansberg Spring, dated March 1993. A copy of the report has been submitted to the State Engineer in support of Proofs of Appropriation filed by Donald S. and Kristina M. Forrester, Donald T. and Peggy Hall, Robert S. and June E. Severson, Theadore and Katherine A. Weber, Ron and Ginger Mitchell, Ernest E. Pestana and Joy Whipple, referring to the waters of Sheridan Creek and Stutler Canyon Creek.

DESCRIPTION OF DIVERSION, ITEMS 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 9.

The water flowing in Stutler Canyon Creek is diverted from its channel at a point in the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 16, T.12N, R.19E, M.D.M. and into a pipeline. Water is also diverted from Gansberg Spring under Permit No. 7595, Certificate No. 1760, in the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of said Section 16, and the pipeline diversion from Gansberg Spring joins the diversion from Stutler Canyon Creek at a point in the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of said Section 16. From the point

where the two pipelines join, the water of Stutler Canyon Creek and Gansberg Spring were originally diverted easterly from the point of confluence via a pipeline located north of and aligned approximately parallel to the south line of the N 1/2 of Section 15, T.12N., R.19E., M.D.M. and discharged to cultivated lands located generally east of Old Foothill Road (now Sheridan Lane) and south of Centerville Lane, including the lands owned by the Claimants.

At some date between 1966 and 1974 a portion of the pipeline diversion from Stutler Canyon Creek and Gansberg Spring was relocated. From a point near the center of Section 15, the pipeline was aligned in a southeasterly direction to Sheridan Creek. Physical evidence and a conservation plan map prepared in 1973 indicate that the pipeline crossed Sheridan Creek, then was aligned approximately parallel to Sheridan Creek and extended to a point approximately 200 feet east of Old Foothill Road where the waters of Stutler Canyon Creek and Gansberg Spring were mingled with the waters of Sheridan Creek and Barber Creek.

In recent years, the pipeline crossing of Sheridan Creek has been removed, and the water diverted from Stutler Canyon Creek and Gansberg Spring is discharged directly into the North Diversion of Sheridan Creek.

The map which accompanies this Proof of Appropriation indicates point of diversion and location and alignment of the pipeline as

originally constructed and as relocated in 1966 to 1974. Date of survey for the points of diversion and original pipeline location refers to date indicated on the map filed in the office of the State Engineer by E.H. Sweetland, State Water Right Surveyor, July 29, 1930.

The relocation of the pipeline during the period 1966 to 1974 and the manner in which the water was used thereafter were contrary to vested rights established by water use prior to 1905 with respect to Stutler Creek water and are contrary to provisions of Permit No. 7595 and Certificate No. 1760 with respect to Gansberg Spring water. The original location of the pipeline as indicated on the E.H. Sweetland map has been used to identify lands which have justifiable claims of vested right to the waters of Stutler Canyon Creek and to identify place of use of the water appropriated from Gansberg Spring by Certificate No. 1760.

The Claimants assert claim of ownership in the pipeline and works of diversion in the same percentage as they assert claim of vested right to the waters of Stutler Canyon Creek (Item 9). Also see response to Items 13 and 20.

DESCRIPTION OF CLAIM OF VESTED RIGHT AND DATE OF PRIORITY OF USE,
ITEMS 13, 15 AND 16.

The map which accompanies this Proof of Appropriation identifies lands which have vested right to use of Stutler Canyon Creek water

based on evidence of use established prior to March 1, 1905, continuing to the present time. Table 6-1, page 6-26, of the Sharp report contains a summary of land areas by 40 acre sectional subdivision which have verifiable claims of vested right and the total annual appropriation based on duty of 4.0 acre feet per acre during the irrigation season and 2.02 acre feet annual appropriation for separate domestic use.

A tabulation of cultivated acreage within quarter-quarter sections and type of cultivation is also provided on the map which accompanies this Proof of Appropriation.

Date of priority of use for the vested rights claimed to the waters of Stutler Canyon Creek cannot be determined precisely from the historical record, but is known to be prior to March 1, 1905 from a reference in Certificate No. 1760 to vested right from Stutler Creek. The certificate of Appropriation, approved by State Engineer George W. Malone in 1932, contains a statement that the Gansberg Spring appropriation is supplementary to vested right to waters of Sheridan Creek and Stattler Creek. (Stutler Creek has also been know as Stattler Creek.) The State Engineer in issuing Certificate No. 1760 was satisfied that the diversion of water from Stutler Creek had been initiated prior to March 1, 1905 or he would not have identified the use as a vested right. The Certificate does not state an exact date of priority of use for the vested rights for Sheridan Creek or Stutler Creek water.

Because exact date of priority of use cannot be established, a date of January 1, 1905 has been designated as the date to indicate a use established prior to March 1, 1905. There is no evidence to indicate that vested rights with an earlier date of priority of use could be claimed for other lands not included in Table 6-1.

The historical record indicates that irrigation of lands now owned by Claimants using the water of Stutler Canyon Creek has been continuous since the use was initiated. (See Sharp Report, Subsection 6.2.) The full water right was used in every year, except during years when the yield from Stutler Canyon Creek was insufficient to supply the full water right. During years in which yield was deficient, the maximum amount of water available was used.

Justification and documentation used to identify lands with vested rights to Stutler Canyon Creek water are described in Subsection 6.2 of the Sharp Report. Historical evidence uses to establish date of priority of use is also cited in Subsection 6.2 of the report.

DESCRIPTION OF HALL CLAIM OF VESTED RIGHT, ITEMS 13, 16 AND 20.

Claimants Donald T. and Peggy Hall assert claim of vested right to 12.97 percent of the water flowing in Stutler Canyon Creek at the designated point of diversion during the period May 1 to October 15 annually, .2644 cubic feet per second, not to exceed 88.12 acre

feet to irrigate 22.03 acres.

Table 6-2 of the Sharp Report (beginning on page 6-28) summarizes vested rights for Stutler Canyon Creek water for all land parcels for which vested rights can be claimed. Land parcels are identified by the Douglas County Assessor's parcel number designation. The map which accompanies this Proof of Appropriation also includes tabulation of cultivated acreage for separate parcels. The Claimants own APN 19-212-42.

Claimants also assert claim of vested right to a portion of the waters of Sheridan Creek under separate Proof of Appropriation, supplementary to vested right from Stutler Canyon Creek, for 22.03 acres and assert claim to a portion of the waters of Gansberg Spring heretofore appropriated under Certificate of Appropriation No. 1760, Permit No. 7595, supplementary to vested rights from Sheridan Creek and Stutler Canyon Creek for 22.03 acres. Claimants limit their claims to a maximum of 4.0 acre feet per acre from all sources during the period May 1 to October 15.

Claimants also assert claim of vested right to a portion of the waters of Stutler Canyon Creek for stock watering and for domestic use during the period January 1 to December 31 of each year.



GENERAL

Claims of vested right by Donald T. and Peggy Hall to a portion of the waters of Stutler Canyon Creek are supported by information contained in a report prepared by Milton L. Sharp, P.E., State Water Right Surveyor No. 784, titled Water Rights and Water Resources Investigation, Sheridan Creek, Stutler Creek and Gansberg Spring, dated March 1993. A copy of the report has been submitted to the State Engineer in support of Proofs of Appropriation filed by Donald S. and Kristina M. Forrester, Donald T. and Peggy Hall, Robert S. and June E. Severson, Theodore and Katherine A. Weber, Ron and Ginger Mitchell, and Ernest E. Pestana, Trustee, referring to the waters of Sheridan Creek and Stutler Canyon Creek.

POINT OF DIVERSION

The water is diverted from its source, via a diversion structure, pipeline and unnamed ditches at a point within the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 16, T. 12 N., R. 19 E., M.D.M. from which the southeast corner of said Section 16 bears S 27° 10' 24" E a distance of 2,892.59 feet. The waters of Stutler Canyon Creek are then conveyed through a pipeline to a point in the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of Section 15, T. 12 N., R. 19 E., M.D.M. where the waters of Stutler

Canyon Creek are commingled with the waters of Sheridan Creek in the Sheridan Creek channel. The commingled waters are diverted from the Sheridan Creek channel at a point in the NE 1/4 SE 1/4 OF SECTION 15, T. 12 N., R. 19 E., M.D.M. at a point from which the southwest corner of said Section 15 bears S 72° 20' 31" W a distance of 5,412. 47 feet.

DESCRIPTION OF DIVERSION, ITEMS 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7 and 9.

The water flowing in Stutler Canyon Creek is diverted from its channel at a point in the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of Section 16, T. 12 N, R. 19 E., M.D.M. and into a pipeline. Water is also diverted from Gansberg Spring under Permit No. 7595, Certificate No. 1760, in the SE 1/4 SE 1/4 of said Section 16, and the pipeline diversion from Gansberg Spring joins the diversion from Stutler Canyon Creek at a point in the SE 1/4 NE 1/4 of said Section 16. From the point where the two pipelines join, the water of Stutler Canyon Creek and Gansberg Spring were originally diverted easterly from the point of confluence via a pipeline located north of and aligned approximately parallel to the south line of the N 1/2 of Section 15, T. 12 N., R. 19 E., M.D.M. and discharged to cultivated lands located generally east of Old Foothill Road (now Sheridan Lane) and south of Centerville Lane, including the lands owned by the Claimants.

At some date between 1966 and 1974 a portion of the pipeline diversion from Stutler Canyon Creek and Gansberg Spring was

relocated. From a point near the center of Section 15, the pipeline was aligned in a southeasterly direction to Sheridan Creek. Physical evidence and a conservation plan map prepared in 1973 indicate that the pipeline crossed Sheridan Creek, then was aligned approximately parallel to Sheridan Creek and extended to a point approximately 200 feet east of Old Foothill Road where the waters of Stutler Canyon Creek and Gansberg Spring were mingled with the waters of Sheridan Creek and Barber Creek.

Table 6-1, page 6-26, of the Sharp report contains a summary of land areas by 40 acre sectional subdivision which have verifiable claims of vested right and the total annual appropriation based on duty of 4.0 acre feet per acre during the irrigation season and 2.02 acre feet annual appropriation for separate domestic use.

A tabulation of cultivated acreage within quarter-quarter sections and type of cultivation is also provided on the map which accompanies this Proof of Appropriation.

Land parcels are identified by the Douglas County Assessor's parcel number designation. The map which accompanies this Proof of Appropriation also includes tabulation of cultivated acreage for separate parcels. The Claimants own APN 19-212-42.

Claimants also assert claim of vested right to a portion of the

waters of Sheridan Creek under separate Proof of Appropriation, supplementary to vested right from Stutler Canyon Creek, for 22.03 acres and assert claim to a portion of the waters of Gansberg Spring heretofore appropriated under Certificate of Appropriation No. 1760, Permit No. 7595, supplementary to vested rights from Sheridan Creek and Stutler Canyon Creek for 22.03 acres. Claimants limit their claims to a maximum of 4.0 acre feet per acre from all sources during the period May 1 to October 15.

Claimants also assert claim of vested right to a portion of the waters of Stutler Canyon Creek for stock watering and for domestic use during the period January 1 to December 31 of each year.
