THE RATE OF FLOW WILL BE CONSIDERABLY SMALLER THAN IS NEEDED TO PROVIDE WATER FOR STOCKWATERING PURPOSES, THEREFORE A VOLUME OF WATER IS MORE REPRESENTATIVE OF THE NEEDS OF THE ANIMALS.

**SUMMARY OF PRIORITY OF IRRIGATION USE
BY
BIEROTH RANCH**

The Bieroth Ranch makes use of water for irrigation, domestic and livestock purposes of the following streams:

Van Duzer Creek and its tributary, Trail Creek
Owyhee River
Chicken Creek
Mill Creek

VAN DUZER CREEK

Records of the State Water Engineer contain Proof 01020 on this creek with a claimed priority of 1885, the basis of the claim being a Notice of Claim Location executed by Samuel E. McGinnes recorded in Book 3 of Miscellaneous Records at Page 548, Elko County, Nevada. The place of use is within Homestead Entry Survey 71. It is noted that the proof states that 71.01 acres are irrigated while the tabulation on the proof shows a total of 98.10 acres. The proof may require amendment. In addition, Mr. Bieroth has indicated that there is an additional diversion of this creek within the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 25, Township 45 North, Range 53 East, MDB&M, approximately 200 feet upstream from the point where the main ditch crosses Chicken Creek, which he felt should be included. As this is not a diversion from the channel, but a ditch, it may not be desired to include in the map.

As the diversion point on Van Duzer Creek is immediately below the point where Trail Creek enters Van Duzer Creek, Mr. Bieroth has felt that Trail Creek should be included as a source. The affidavit of George Nelson filed with the proof concerns use upon Van Duzer Creek and Chicken Creek, which apparently includes not only Homestead Entry Survey 71 but also Homestead Entry Survey 225.

Under Applications 23601 through 23605, a map was prepared, apparently to supplement the proof.

The existing proof apparently does not include Homestead Entry Survey 225.

The diversion of water by Joseph R. Paleni and W. D. Hand along Van Duzer Creek is further evidenced by an article in "The Mountain City News" of January 12, 1898 which states they are stockmen in that area.

No information for priority prior to 1885 is found.

CHICKEN CREEK

It appears that the affidavit of George Nelson applies to that portion of Homestead Entry Survey 71 on Chicken Creek, together with Van Duzer Creek. For that reason, the 1885 priority date appears correct.

The proof as filed shows a very small part of Homestead Entry Survey 225. A further claim of water from Chicken Creek is found in a claim executed by William T. McGinnes recorded in Book 3 of Miscellaneous Records at Page 548 for 400 miner's inches with the point of diversion being one and one-quarter miles from the mouth of the creek with a priority date of 1888. This would encompass a portion of Homestead Entry Survey 225. It is not apparent if this claim was included in the previous proof.

OWYHEE RIVER

There is no evidence of use of water from the Owyhee River, primarily within Homestead Entry Survey 167, except for Application 23601 which states diversion would be by a pump. It is understood this has not been done.

MILL CREEK

The lands upon Mill Creek are portions of Homestead Entry Surveys 63, 93 and 204 and are owned as to an undivided one-half interest by Bieroth Ranch with the other one-half owned by heirs of Hugh C. Bieroth. These lands are in the drainage below the Rio Tinto Mine and presently have a water right under Certificate 2382, Permit 9610 with a priority of 1932. Drainage from the old mine dumps has eliminated the meadow shown under the proof map, and it is presently of pasture use.

The only evidence of early diversion of water is of two land claims, one by Michael McCall and the other by T. B. Kerr recorded in Book 1 of Land Claims at Pages 77 and 78, which may substantiate a priority of 1870. As this land is owned one-half by Bieroth Ranch and one-half by the heirs, it will be necessary for Dennis Bieroth to make the decision if he desires to pursue a vested water right.

A Mrs. J. R. McGinness is assessed for a possessory claim approximately two miles from Mountain City in 1888, which would possibly be upon Mill Creek.

In connection with the water rights to be claimed, there is some ditch and culture information on the Homestead Entry Surveys, all of which were prepared after 1920. These are available at the BLM.

BIEROTH RANCH

LIVESTOCK AREAS OF USE AND NUMBERS

In addition to vested water rights for livestock on improved ranch lands, this ranch makes use upon other privately owned lands and public lands within the Humboldt National Forest upon the Chicken Creek allotment.

At the present, a permit is held for 253 head of livestock. The allotment is divided into four separate fields and managed under a deferred rotation system. This results in use being made by the total numbers in the different drainages at portions of the year.

For example, the entire permitted numbers may use the Mill Creek waters for the period of March, April and May in one calendar year and then be moved to the Chicken Creek drainage for the period of June, July, August and then to the Dry Creek, Rocky Gulch, Rabbit Draw areas for the balance of the grazing season. During the next grazing season, no early use may be made of the Mill Creek water, but only late season use. However, over a number of grazing seasons the total number of permitted livestock will make use of any one water during the entire grazing season from March 1 to November 30. The actual season of use non-allowed by the Forest Service is less than March 1 to November 30, unless such early or late use is authorized. However, during the administration of the area the season of use has been shortened from that prior to 1905.

In the case where more than one drainage is found in a separate field, the total numbers of livestock are divided among those waters.

Based upon the above, the following use for domestic livestock under a vested water right is claimed:

Mill Creek, its tributary of McCall Creek and other tributaries and springs in its drainage area	255 Head
Chicken Creek, its tributary of Little Chicken Creek and other tributaries and springs in its drainage area	255 Head
Rabbit Draw and springs in its drainage area	150 Head
Rocky Gulch and springs in its drainage area	150 Head
Dry Creek and springs in its drainage area	150 Head

All use being for the period of March 1 to November 30.

No definite priority information has been found. However, Forest Service regulations require that a present holder of a permit must be a successor in interest which grazed livestock upon the Forest Service lands prior to 1905. Based upon this, vested livestock water rights are claimed upon the Forest Service lands.

This property makes use of water for irrigation, together with supplementary uses of domestic and livestock upon private lands from the following streams:

Van Duzer Creek
 Chicken Creek
 Owyhee River
 Mill Creek

Proofs of vested water rights have been filed on only Van Duzer Creek and Chicken Creek under Proofs 02616 and 01020. Proof 01020 specifies 71.01 acres, but the culture map shows 98.10 irrigated acres from Van Duzer Creek. An amended proof will correct acreage. Proof 02616 claims 45.60 acres from Chicken Creek.

Permits have been issued or applied for. A summary of all available filings in the State Water office is as follows:

VAN DUZER CREEK

The proof which has been filed states that the claimant's water right was filed in Book 3 of Miscellaneous Records at Page 548 with a priority of 1885 and the place of use described in Homestead Entry Survey 71. This document claims a priority of 1888, but apparently 1885 was the date use actually began.

CHICKEN CREEK

The proof which has been filed states that the claimant's water right was not filed in the office of the County Recorder of Elko County, Nevada. However, a Statement of Water Right by William T. McGinness lists a point of diversion about 1½ miles from the mouth of Chicken Creek as recorded in Book 3 of Miscellaneous Records at Page 548 with a priority of 1888. It appears that this priority should also be 1885 as claimed in the proof.

OWYHEE RIVER

No proof was found in the office of the State Water Engineer as to use on the Owyhee River. Application 23601 was apparently made for this purpose. However, a Statement of Water Right executed by James L. McGinness locates a point of diversion about two miles above the Vance Mill Dam, said statement recorded in Book 3 of Miscellaneous Records at Page 558, Elko County, Nevada, claiming diversion in 1888.

In an Affidavit executed by S. E. McGinness for Joseph R. Paleni, recorded in the office of the County Recorder of Elko County, Nevada concerning the I F brand, he states in 1913 that he has been a resident of the area for forty years which would be 1873. Therefore, his claim of priority of 1885 appears appropriate.

The above concerns Homestead Entry Surveys 71, 167 and 225. Proofs 01020 and 02616 refer to an Affidavit by George Nelson. This Affidavit was not supplied in the information received and should be reviewed to attempt to corroborate the statements made above, as the descriptions contained in the Statement of Water Rights are difficult to locate with any certainty.

MILL CREEK

The State Water Engineer's office does not show any vested rights upon Mill Creek. However, they do show a certificate with a date of priority of 1932. In the event it is possible to show an earlier priority through proof of vested water rights, this should be done.
