



AFFIDAVIT

To Whom it May Concern:

I, Julian Goicoechea, retired, was born March 4, 1914, at Elko, Nevada. My parents, Pete and Guadalupe Goicoechea, were living at the Home Ranch on Hanks Creek at the time. The Home Ranch was purchased from Pete Corta Sheep Company in 1912 by the Goicoechea Brothers. I lived on the Home Ranch for many years. I went to school in Gold Creek at the Island Mtn. School. About 60 acres of hay on the Home Ranch were irrigated from ditches within the fenced property when purchased. It was my understanding that the Home Ranch on Hanks Creek was settled in about 1898. In those early times, hay land was fenced to protect against other cattle and sheep users. It was also my understanding that the Charlie Howard's main homestead on the upper Owyhee River, two miles from the Mountain City Highway on the Charleston Road and 3 miles northeast of Home Ranch, was also settled about the same time as the Home Ranch. From the time I can remember, these properties were fenced, hayed and watered. It was also my understanding that the Pete Corta Sheep Company was running about 10,000 head of sheep in 1912, at the time of purchase, and that it had done so for at least 10 years previous. It is also my understanding that Clayton and Hylton, which were property owners on the North Fork of the Humboldt River, grazed livestock in both the North Fork of the Humboldt River and the Upper Owyhee River watersheds in 1898, being some 10,000 head of cattle and 5,000 head of sheep.

Affidavit

To Whom it May Concern:

I, John W. Oldham, a rancher, was born June 17, 1907, while my parents, Ed and Kate Oldham, were living at the Dinner Station, about 30 miles north of Elko. I presently own and operate Fox Springs Ranch, about three miles northwest of Dinner Station. My Mother and Father operated the Dinner Station from 1902 to 1911. In 1912 they homesteaded the Fox Springs Ranch. Before 1902, my parents owned and operated a bar in Mountain City. Between approximately 1912 and 1934 my father also delivered supplies and picked up wool and other items for many of the ranchers between Elko and Mountain City. I delivered supplies when I was about 15 or 16 years old for my father. When I first started, we had a 1916 chain driven Mack truck, which I still have today at the Fox Springs Ranch, before that my father had a one ton Republic truck. I remember going with my father on deliveries of supplies to Charlie Howard, part Indian, and we picked up wool at this place, at which time I saw haystacks, meadows and buildings and that Charlie Howard's main homestead, on the upper Owyhee River, was two miles from the Mountain City Highway on the Charleston Road. I remember that my father told me that Charlie Howard had taken up the homesteads, and also a Mr. Hanks, on what became known as the Goicoechea home ranch, on Hanks Creeks, which the creek was named after. Both Howard and Hanks homesteads started at about the same time as W.W. Williams and his brother, George, made their summer headquarters at Gold Creek, which was just before the turn of the century. I also remember my father told me that Mr. Hanks was a relative of Mrs. Johnson, who owned the North Fork Ranch (on the North Fork of the Humboldt). Mrs. Johnson's daughter, Lily, married Chester Laing, who owned the Laing Ranch, also on the North Fork of the Humboldt. I remember that my father told me that both Mr. Hanks and Mr. Howard had their small ranches, raising stock, cutting hay, and fenced before I was born. I also remember that my father told me that Mr. Hanks sold his homestead (on Hanks Creek) to one of the sheep outfits. Mr. Howard's ranch was sold in about 1918, which also went to one of the sheep outfits.






